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Madrid, February 7.

**T**HE Marquis de Leganes is, we hear, designed Governor of Milan, in the place of the Count de Fuentes, whose time is expired; and the Marquis *Henriques d'Aquilar*, General of the Artillery there, is named to be *Maistre de Camp-General* of that State, in the room of the Count de *Lorraine*, who is going for Flanders to take possession of his Government of *Hainault*. Commissions have been lately given out for the raising of several new Regiments to serve in *Catalonia*, where 'tis resolved to have the next Campaign an Army of 14000 Foot and 4000 Horse. Our Sea Preparations are likewise hastened, Orders being given for the fitting out 20 Men of War, which 'tis said will be ready to put to Sea by the end of the next Month. At the same time the Council of State is employ'd about sending considerable Supplies of Money to Flanders and Milan. The Ambassador of Morocco has in a manner finished his Negotiation about the Exchange of the Prisoners taken the last year at *Larache*; We are told, that 'tis agreed to deliver to him the Books of the *Alcoran* now remaining in the *Escurial*, and to give 10 Moors for every Spanish Officer, who are about 100 in all. We have an account from *Cadix*, that on the 17th of the last Month sailed from thence 3 Ships bound to *Buenos Ayres*, and that Publick Notice had been given, that the *New-Spain* Fleet would depart the next Month.

*Milan, February 14.* We hear, that the *Montenrias* have at last agreed to pay 5000 *Scudi* a Month for the Subsistence of the Imperial Troops, which by the Emperor's Order are quartered in that Country. The Marquis *d'Obizzi*, the Emperor's Envoy, is gone for *Florence*.

*Venice, February 16.* On the 12th instant returned hither the Senator *Lando* from his Embassy at *Rome*. This week was published here a Prohibition of all Commerce with *Ragusa*, *Zappanti*, *Mezzo*, and other Neighbouring Places, because of the Infestation that is broke out in those Parts. The Duke of *Marsena* is come hither to partake of the Divergements of the *Carnival*. The last Letters from *Rome* say, that the Conclave was to be opened on Monday last, in order to the Election of a new Pope.

*Vicenza, February 18.* The Count de *Thun*, whom the Emperor has named his Envoy Extraordinary to the Court of *Poland*, will set out in few days on his Journey thither. The Envoy to the Czars of *Moscow* is already on his way; and the last advices from thence give us reason to believe, that he will find them in a disposition to comply with what he has Orders to propose from the Emperor.

The Pope's Nuncio has now permission to come to Court again; and the Emperor's Envoy at *Rome*, who was upon his departure from thence, is directed to continue there. The Cardinal *Colonizi* is gone thither to assist at the Conclave.

*Francofort, Febr. 25.* 'Tis said, that the Elector of *Saxony* has given Orders for his Troops to be in a readiness by the 20th of the next Month to march towards the *Rhine*. A Regiment is raising in these Parts for the Service of the State of *Milan*.

*Dublin, February 23.* Lieutenant-General *Ginkle* is marched with some of Their Majesties Forces towards *Ballymore*, upon notice that *Sarsfield* was drawn down thither with a Body of the Enemies Troops pretending to fortify that place, so that if the Rebels do not retire after their usual manner, we may in a day or two expect to hear of some Action. From *Corke* of the 6th instant we have an account, that a Party of our Men marched lately from *Balimagoosly* into the Irish Quarters, where they killed 25 of the Rebels, and brought off 300 Head of Black Cattle, and as many Sheep, with some Horses; And that Major *Kirke* having notice of a Party of the Rebels, went out on the 3d instant with a Detachment of his Men, fought them, killed 16 of them, and took three of their Officers Prisoners, viz. Colonel *Furcell*, Captain *Collaghan*, and another whose Name is not yet known. On the 13th, 400 of the Rebels came to *Edenderry*, burnt part of the Town, and killed 7 Men and one Woman, but they were bravely repulld by the Militia, who killed 11 of them. By three Deserters, two of them Officers, that are come from the Enemies Quarters, 'tis confirmed, that the Irish are very much dissatisfied with the small Supply brought them by *Tyrconnel*, and that they are falling into great disorder and confusion. Divers Protestants come from *Limerick* say the same, and complain of the ill Usage they received from the Irish. The Deserters report likewise, that *Sarsfield* is made Earl of *Lucan* and Lieutenant-General, *Darlington* Major General, and *Barker* General of their Foot. From *Kinsale* by Letters of the 6th instant we have advice, that Their Majesties Ships the *Montague*, Captain *Faulks* Commander, and the *Dobell*, Captain *Whitaker*, arrived there two days before, and brought in with them a French Privateer of 24 Guns; and that they intended to sail again with the first fair Wind.
