Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to

the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

WITH reference to the Notification in the London Gazette of the 18th October, 1887, respecting the British Protectorate of the Niger Districts, and to certain agreements entered into between the British and German Governments, it is hereby notified, for public information, that the portion of the Protectorate under the administration of Her Majesty's Commissioner and Consul-General will, from the date of this notification, form a separate Protectorate, under the name of the "Niger Coast Protectorate," and will cease to be known as the "Oil Rivers Protectorate."

The eastern limit of the line of coast of the Niger Coast Protectorate is defined in the agreement between the British and German Governments of the 14th of April, 1893.

(a.) The ten days' quarantine imposed on arrivals with passengers from the littoral of Tripoli is reduced to five days. If the vessels have no passengers, they will undergo a strict medical visit.

(b.) The five days' quarantine imposed on travellers coming from Persia (Bayazid to Hannequiné) is reduced to 24 hours' observation, with disinfection of goods, &c.

the following Sanitary Notice relative to vessels visiting Hamburg:—

(Translation.)

Sanitary Inspection by Hamburg Harbour Medical Officials of all Vessels arriving at Hamburg from Seaways.

It is hereby made publicly known that all vessels which are upon arrival at Cuxhaven liable to sanitary police control in pursuance of the decree respecting the sanitary control of vessels visiting ports of Hamburg, dated the 11th of July, 1883, will, in addition thereto, be further subjected upon arrival in the Hamburg harbour to examination by the local harbour medical inspector, who will be telegraphically advised previous to the arrival of the vessel. The master is responsible that no one quits the ship previous to the inspection being completed, and must comply with the orders of the medical inspector. The same regulations apply at Hamburg to all vessels on board of which a case of fever, dysentery, eruption of any description, or scurvy has occurred, as well as to those which have not been subjected to police sanitary supervision at Cuxhaven. Notification of any such case of sickness on board must be immediately made by the master to the harbour doctor. Breach of these regulations render liability to punishment under Section 327 of the German Penal Code.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of the following Notice, issued by Her Majesty's Representative at Cyprus:—

No. 2042. Smallpox.

In consequence of an outbreak of smallpox at Rhodes, His Excellency the High Commissioner, under the power and authority vested in him by "The Infectious Diseases Prevention Ordinance, 1883," has been pleased to order that all passengers arriving thence will be submitted to the following regulations before being allowed to land in Cyprus:—

Any vessel arriving at any port in Cyprus, except Larnaca, from Rhodes with passengers for Cyprus is to be medically inspected before being admitted to pratique, and, in the event of there being any case, or suspected case of smallpox on board, pratique will be refused, and the vessel is to be ordered to proceed to Larnaca, a note to that effect being made on the Bill of Health, and the Chief Medical Officer is to be at once informed by telegram.

All arrivals at Larnaca from Rhodes are to be carefully inspected before being admitted to pratique, and for further security all persons wishing to land are to be carefully visited on the end of the pier, in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief Medical Officer.

In the event of any person being found to be affected with smallpox, the said person, with his relations, friends, and servants accompanying him, if any, will be isolated in quarantine, and the Chief Medical Officer is to be immediately advised of the fact by telegram.

THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

SOUTHEND FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Justices of the Peace acting for the Division of Rochford, in the county of Essex, that a Fair has been annually held on Whit Monday and several following days, in the Old Town, Southend, in the parish of Prittlewell, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished :

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into

consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871:"

And whereas on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished :

And whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Southend, as owners of the said Fair and the tolls thereof, have consented, in writing, that the said Fair should be abolished.

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fair which has been annually held on Whit Monday and several following days, in the Old Town, Southend, in the parish of Prittlewell, shall be abolished as from the date of this Order.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board; Meetings of Boards of Guardians:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Separate Parishes in England and Wales, except the Guardians of the Poor within the City of Oxford;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain General and other Orders from time to time issued by the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and by Us, the Local Government Board, regulations have been prescribed with respect to the holding of the ordinary Meetings of the Board of Guardians of each of the several Unions and Separate Parishes above referred to ;

And whereas it is expedient to make further provision on the subject as hereinafter mentioned :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows ; that is to say,—

When the day for holding an ordinary Meeting of the Board of Guardians of any of the said Unions or Separate Parishes shall fall upon Good Friday, Christmas Day, a Bank Holiday, or a day appointed for a public fast or thanksgiving, such Meeting shall be held on such other day as the Board of Guardians may by resolution determine.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The provisions of Article 73 (*Swine-Fever Infected Circle*) of the Animals Order of 1886, as amended by Article 2 of the Animals (Amendment) Order of 1888, No. 2, shall apply and extend to and be in force in the District mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall

continue to apply and extend to and be in force in that District until the Board of Agriculture by further Special Order direct and order; and the Order of the Privy Council dated the sixteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, which applies the said provisions to certain Districts therein named, shall be read and have effect as if the District named in the Schedule to this Order was also named in that Order.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.
