

hereby pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Seal Fishery (Behring's Sea) Order in Council, 1893.

2. From and after the date of the present Order until the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, unless Her Majesty in Council shall otherwise direct, the catching of seals by British ships in Behring's Sea as hereinafter defined is hereby prohibited.

3. For the purposes of the said recited Act and of this Order the expression "Behring's Sea" means so much of that part of the Pacific Ocean known as Behring's Sea as lies between the parallel of 65° 30' north latitude and the chain of the Aleutian Islands, and eastward of the following line of demarcation, that is to say, a line commencing at a point in Behring's Straits on the said parallel of 65° 30' north latitude, at its intersection by the meridian which passes midway between the Islands of Krusenstern or Ignalook and the Island of Ratmanoff or Noonarbook and proceeding thence in a course nearly south-west through Behring's Straits and the seas known as Behring's Sea, so as to pass midway between the north-west point of the Island of Saint Lawrence and the south-east point of Cape Choukotski to the meridian of 172° west longitude, thence, from the intersection of that meridian in a south-westerly direction so as to pass midway between the Island of Attou and the Copper Island of the Kormandorski couplet or group in the North Pacific Ocean, to the meridian of 193° west longitude.

WHEREAS in pursuance of "The Bishops' Resignation Act 1869" a representation has been made to Her Majesty by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, at the instance of the Honourable and Right Reverend John Thomas by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Norwich, and as such a Bishop of a diocese within and of the said Province of Canterbury, that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric by reason that he is incapacitated by age and permanent physical infirmity from the due performance of his duties as Bishop.

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned.

Now therefore Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared that the said Bishopric of Norwich is vacant, and Her Majesty by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct and it is hereby directed that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Norwich.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the forty-fifth and forty-sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "The Militia Act,

1882," it is, amongst other things, enacted that, save as therein otherwise provided, the Militia shall be trained and exercised for not less than twenty-one days and not more than twenty-eight days in every year, at such times and at such places in every part of the United Kingdom as Her Majesty may appoint, and also that Her Majesty may, from time to time, with the advice of Her Privy Council, order that the period of training and exercise in any year, of all or any part of the Militia be extended, but so that the whole period of training and exercise be not more than fifty-six days:

And whereas it is expedient that the training of the Durham Artillery, Western Division, Royal Artillery, the Northumbeland Artillery, Western Division, Royal Artillery, the Yorkshire Artillery, Western Division, Royal Artillery, the Mid-Ulster Artillery, Southern Division, Royal Artillery, the Limerick City Artillery, Southern Division, Royal Artillery, the Tipperary Artillery, Southern Division, Royal Artillery, the Waterford Artillery, Southern Division, Royal Artillery, and also of the Royal Anglesey Engineer Militia, Fortress Forces, Royal Engineers, the Royal Monmouthshire Engineer Militia, Fortress Forces, Royal Engineers, and of the several Divisions of the Engineer Militia, Submarine Miners, Royal Engineers, should be extended beyond the period of twenty-eight days for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

Now therefore, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and direct that the period of training and exercise of the before-mentioned Regiments and Divisions of Militia, shall, for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, be extended, under the provisions of the before-cited Act, from twenty-eight days to the number of days in each case hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Durham Artillery, Western Division, Royal Artillery, thirty-four (34) days.

Northumberland Artillery, Western Division, Royal Artillery, thirty-four (34) days.

Yorkshire Artillery, Western Division, Royal Artillery, thirty-four (34) days.
