

Gresham-road to a point opposite to the centre of Saint Paul's-road, distant twenty-six feet from the south-western boundary of a close numbered 76 upon the Ordnance Map, Scale $\frac{1}{2500}$ Sheet XLVII 2, thence by a straight line to the boundary of the said close, thence in a south-easterly direction along the said boundary to a point distant two hundred and twenty-four feet from the centre of Mawson-road, thence by a straight line to the centre of Mawson-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Mawson-road to the centre of Lyndewode-road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Lyndewode-road to the centre of Tenison-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Tenison-road to a point opposite to the centre of Devonshire-road, thence in an easterly direction to and along the centre of Devonshire-road to a point opposite to the south-western corner of the premises of the Midland Railway Company, thence in an easterly direction to and along the southern boundary of the said premises to the centre of the Great Eastern Railway, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the said railway to the boundary of the borough, thence in a westerly and northerly direction along the said boundary to the boundary of Ward No. 5; thence in a northerly and easterly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 5 to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 7 otherwise Romsey Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Cambridge as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the boundary of the borough with the eastern boundary of Ward No. 6 on the Great Eastern Railway thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said railway to the boundary of the borough on the River Cam thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 8 otherwise Petersfield Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Cambridge as is contained within a line commencing from a point in the boundary of Ward No. 4 opposite to the centre of Gresham-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 4 to a point in the east road opposite to the centre of Broad-street, thence to and along the centre of Broad-street in an easterly direction to a point opposite to the centre of Flower-street thence in and along the centre of Flower-street in a northerly and easterly direction to the centre of Blossom-street thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Blossom-street to the centre of Norfolk-street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Norfolk-street to the centre of Gwydir-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Gwydir-street to a point opposite to the centre of Milford-street, thence to and along the centre of Milford-street in an easterly direction to the centre of Sturton-street, thence to and along the centre of Sturton-street in a southerly direction to a point opposite to the centre of Sleaford-street, thence to and along the centre of Sleaford-street in an easterly direction to a point distant one hundred and forty-four feet from the point of intersection of Sleaford-street and Ainsworth-street, thence eastwards in a straight line to the boundary of Ward No. 7 in the centre of the Great Eastern Railway, thence in a south-westerly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 7 to the boundary of Ward No. 6, thence in a north-

westerly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 9 otherwise Saint Matthew's Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Cambridge as is contained within a line commencing from the point aforesaid in Fitzroy-street opposite to the centre of City-road in the boundary of Ward No. 4, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the centre of Fitzroy-street to the centre of East-road, thence to and along the centre of New-street-passage in a south-easterly direction to the centre of New-street, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of New-street to the centre of Abbey-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Abbey-street to the centre of Newmarket-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the Newmarket-road to the boundary of Ward No. 7, thence in a south-westerly direction along the said boundary to the boundary of Ward No. 8, thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of Ward No. 8 to the boundary of Ward No. 4, thence along the eastern boundary of Ward No. 4 to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 10 otherwise Abbey Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Cambridge as is contained within a line commencing from a point in the boundary of Ward No. 2 in the Newmarket-road opposite to the centre of Fair-street thence in an easterly and northerly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 2 to the boundary of the borough in the River Cam, thence in a north-easterly direction along the said boundary to the boundary of Ward No. 7 on the Great Eastern Railway, thence in a south-westerly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 7 to the boundary of Ward No. 9, thence in a south-westerly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 9 to the boundary of Ward No. 4, thence in a westerly and northerly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 4 to the boundary of Ward No. 2, thence in a northerly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I the said Charles Neve Cresswell by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Warrant of Appointment do hereby, out of the Councillors elected by the Burgesses of the borough, assign and apportion three to each and every Ward, as follows, that is to say:—
