The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Portswood situate partly in the town and county of the town of Southampton, and partly in the county of Southampton and wholly in the diocese of Winchester and out of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Luke, Newtown in the said town and county of the town of Southampton and in the diocese aforesaid.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Portswood and of the new parish of Saint Luke Newtown aforesaid which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by virtue of a deed dated the eighteenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three and expressed to be made under the authority of the New Parishes Acts 1843, 1844 and 185-, and being under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England which deed has been or is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of Your Majesty's High Court of Justice, the Reverend Albert Basil Orme Wilberforce, Honorary Canon in the cathedral church of the said diocese of Winchester, the rector of the rectory of the parish of Saint Mary, Southampton, did, with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester and, as such Bishop, the patron of the said rectory and with the concurrence of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, grant and confirm unto the minister or incumbent for the time being of the herein proposed district when and so soon as the same shall have been constituted and to his successors, ministers, or incumbents thereof for the time being, and when the said proposed district shall have become a new parish then to the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the same new parish for the time being, one clear yearly rent-charge of two hundred pounds to be for ever charged upon issuing and payable half yearly out of certain glebe lands and hereditaments belonging to the said rectory as and for a permanent endowment

for the incumbent of the said proposed district or new parish.

"And whereas the said annual rent charge of two hundred pounds has been granted and confirmed as aforesaid by the said Albert Basil Orme Wilberforce upon the understanding and condition that we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners would recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council the arrangement with respect to the patronage of the said proposed district or new parish which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said Albert Basil Orme Wilberforce has nominated to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners himself as the person in whom he desires that the first turn of nomination and appointment of a Minister to serve the said proposed district should be vested, and the said Anthony Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever, as the person or persons in whom he the said Albert Basil Orme Wilberforce desires that the second and every succeeding turn of such nomination and appointment should be vested.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Anthony Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of Portswood and of the said new parish of Saint Luke Newtown which are described in the schedule hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Barnabas Southampton.'

"And we further recommend and propose with such consent and so testified as aforesaid that the advowson and perpetual right of patronage of the district or new parish hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted and the whole right of nomination of the incumbent of the same district or new parish shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day aforesaid being the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and become and be absolutely vested for the first turn only in the said Albert Basil Orme Wilberforce and for the second and every succeeding turn in the said Anthony Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint Barnabas, Southampton comprising—

"All those two contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Portswood partly in the town and county of the town of Southampton and partly in the county of Southampton and wholly in the diocese of Winchester and of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Luke, Newtown in the said town and county of
