Rome, February 10. On the 19th instant their Majesties went from hence to Salva Terra, where they will continue till towards the end of the next Month; but before their departure, the King named Don Pedro de Figuiredo to go as his Envoy Extraordinary to Madrid, who will very fuddenly begin his Journey thither, carrying with him a Jewel of great value, which he is to present from their Majesties to the Queen of Spain.
