Rome, February 10. Lisbon, January 23. The French Ambassador has likewise had his Audiences of Congratulation and Condoleance. On the 19th instant their Majesties went from hence to Salva Terra, where they will continue till towards the end of the next Month; but before their departure, the King named Don Pedro de Figuiredo to go as his Envoy Extraordinary to Madrid, who will very fuddenly begin his Journey thither, carrying with him a Jewel of great value, which he is to present from their Majesties to the Queen of Spain.
