THE Board of Agriculture, acting under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, hereby authorize the Local Authority for the county of Salop to put in operation Article 1 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1890, dated the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety providing for the slaughter by Local Authorities of swine suspected of swine-fever and the payment of compensation for the same.
