WE, Your Majesty's most loyal subjects, the body of English Presbyterian Ministers in and near the Cities of London and Westminster, gladly avail ourselves of our time-honoured privilege of approaching Your Majesty, in order to tender our sincerest congratulations on the Marriage of His Royal Highness the Duke of York to Her Serene Highness the Princess Victoria Mary of Teck.

It has been one of the happy characteristics of Your Majesty's long and beneficent reign that Sovereign and People have ever lived in such close mutual sympathy that no great occasion of joy or sorrow to the one has been unshared by the other. THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Bucharest, viz:—"Vessels from infected ports in France or Asiatic Coast of Red Sea, having had a case of cholera more than seven days before arrival, and not having previously performed quarantine at a Turkish port, will undergo three days' quarantine at Sulina, and if the case has occurred within seven days of arrival then five days' observation. Should fresh cases occur within latter period quarantine prolonged to five days from date of its appearing. Vessels from infected ports not admitted into Kustendje or Mangalia, unless no case of cholera has occurred during entire voyage, or quarantine has been performed at a Turkish lazaretto."

And that in the case of arrivals from French Mediterranean ports the strict supervision of vessels will be maintained, coupled with the disinfection (from the 10th instant) of foul linen.

Journal Officiel Tunisien, July 6th, 1893.

DÉCRET du 5 Juillet 1893 (21 Hidjé, 1310).

Louanges à Dieu.

Nous, Ali Pacha Bey, Possesseur du Royaume de Tunis,

Nous avons pris le décret suivant :

ART. 1. A dater de la promulgation du présent décret, les caravanes et les voyageurs en provenance d'Algérie, entrant dans la Régence par les voies de terre situées au sud de Fériana sont assujetties à une visite sanitaire et à telles mesures de désinfection qui pourront être reconnues nécessaires.

ART. 2. Les vêtements, hardes, linges appartenant aux caravaniers et voyageurs seront désinfectés avant leur entrée sur le territoire de la Régence.

ART. 3. Dans le cas où des voyageurs ou caravaniers seraient reconnus dans un état de santé suspect, ils seront isolés par les soins des autorités locales et assujettis à une observation dont la durée sera fixée par le médecin qui aura constaté leur état.

ART. 4. L'introduction dans la Régence par les points de la frontière ci-dessus désignés, des chiffons, drilles, os, objets de literie et de toute marchandise du genre susceptible est interdite jusqu'à ce qu'il en soit autrement ordonné.

ART. 5. Les contraventions aux dispositions du présent décret seront déferées aux tribunaux compétents.

ART. 6. Notre Premier Ministre et Notre Directeur des Finances sont chargés chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret.
