Nous, Ali Pacha Bey, Possesseur du Royaume de Tunis,

Nous avons pris le décret suivant :

ART. 1. A dater de la promulgation du présent décret, les caravanes et les voyageurs en provenance d'Algérie, entrant dans la Régence par les voies de terre situées au sud de Fériana sont assujetties à une visite sanitaire et à telles mesures de désinfection qui pourront être réconnues nécessaires.

ART. 2. Les vêtements, hardes, linges appartenant aux caravaniers et voyageurs seront désinfectés avant leur entrée sur le territoire de la Régence.

ART. 3. Dans le cas où des voyageurs ou caravaniers seraient reconnus dans un état de santé suspect, ils seront isolés par les soins des autorités locales et assujettis à une observation dont la durée sera fixée par le médecin qui aura constanté leur état.

ART. 4. L'introduction dans la Régence par les points de la frontière ci-dessus désignés, des chiffons, drilles, os, objets de literie et de toute marchandise du genre susceptible est interdite jusqu'à ce qu'il en soit autrement ordonné.

ART. 5. Les contraventions aux dispositions du présent décret seront déférées aux tribunaux

compétents.

ART. 6. Notre Premier Ministre et Notre Directeur des Finances sont chargés chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret.
