Journal Officiel Tunisien, July 13, 1893.

Le Général de Division Mohamed el Aziz Bou Attour, Premier Ministre de S. A. le Bey,

Vu le décret du 20 février 1885 (6 Djoumadi-el-Aoula 1302).

Arrête :

ART. 1. Les provenances de la province de Gérone (Espagne) et les provenances de St-Louis, Couder et Dagana (Sénégal) sont déclarées suspectes.

ART. 2. Les voyageurs débarquant dans la Régence et ayant l'une de ces provenances sont assujettis, à l'arrivée, à une visite sanitaire et à

la désinfection de leur linge, de leurs effets, bagages, etc., et des objets du genre susceptible leur appartenant.

Les mêmes mesures seront appliquées à tout passager d'autres provenances arrivant en Tunisie par des navires ayant transporté des voyageurs ou des objets de provenance suspecte.

ART. 3. Tout voyageur rentrant dans les dites catégories devra déclarer la localité de la Régence où il a l'intention de résider.

ART. 4. Les mêmes mesures seront appliquées aux provenances des ports français de la Méditerranée où des cas de choléra auraient été constatés.

ART. 5. Le Directeur de la santé est chargé de l'exécution du présent arrêté.

Medical inspection of arrivals from Italy, Austria-Hungary, Spain, Egypt, Tunis, and Algiers. Parcel Post from countries subject to quarantine or medical inspection is prohibited.
