ORDER of the Local Government Board: Cholera Regulations: Mooring Station for Ships outside District of Sanitary Authority: Rescinding Order: Consent under Article 6:—

Ports of Hull and Goole.

Hull and Goole Port Sanitary Authority.

To the Hull and Goole Port Sanitary Authority;—

To all Officers of Customs of the Ports of Hull and Goole;—

To the Medical Officer of Health of the said Port Sanitary Authority;—

To all Masters of Ships;—

To all Pilots;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 11th day of June, 1887, which came into operation on the 19th day of July, 1887, We, the Local Government Board, constituted permanently a Joint Board as the Port Sanitary Authority for the whole of the Port of Goole, and for the part of the Customs Port of Hull in the said Order described, such Joint Board to be termed the Hull and Goole Port Sanitary Authority;

And whereas by a further Order dated the 25th day of July, 1887, We made provision for the appointment by the said Port Sanitary Authority of a place known as the "White Booth Roads" as the place where any ship might be moored or anchored for the purposes of the rules and regulations made by Us, and then in force, for the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, and for the prevention of the spread of that disease;

And whereas by an Order dated the 28th day of August, 1890 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), in exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 130 of The Public Health Act, 1875, and by Section 2 of The Public Health Act, 1889, We revoked the Orders which prescribed the rules and regulations hereinbefore referred to, and prescribed other rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of that disease;

And whereas by a further Order dated the 6th day of September, 1892, We made additional Regulations for the prevention of the spread of Cholera, and by Article V thereof directed that

such Order should be read as one with the Regulations;

And whereas it is provided by Article 6 of the Regulations that every Port Sanitary Authority and every other Sanitary Authority within whose District persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming foreign shall, as speedily as practicable, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place where the Master of any ship certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera shall, as required by Article 10 of the Regulations, moor or anchor her until the requirements of the Regulations have been duly fulfilled; and that the place to be fixed as aforesaid shall be some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Sanitary Authority, unless We otherwise consent:

And whereas it is further provided by the said Article 6 that any place fixed as aforesaid, with Our consent, outside the jurisdiction or district of a Sanitary Authority, shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be within such jurisdiction or district;

And whereas the said Port Sanitary Authority propose to fix, in lieu of the place appointed under the provisions of the said Order dated the 25th day of July, 1887, the place hereinafter referred to, and shown on the map or chart in the schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations, and such place being situate without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for Our consent in the matter:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the above-mentioned sections, and of every other power enabling Us in this behalf, do hereby order, direct, and consent as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The said Order dated the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, is hereby rescinded.

ARTICLE II.—We Consent to the said Hull and Goole Port Sanitary Authority fixing, with the approval of the Chief Officers of Customs of the Ports of Hull and Goole, the place shown by the circle drawn in red on the Map or Chart in the Schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship bound to any place within the District of such Port Sanitary Authority, and certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera, shall be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations.

ARTICLE III.—The jurisdiction of the said Port Sanitary Authority shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to extend, and, subject to the provisions of this Order, the Regulations shall apply, to any ship which, in pursuance of the Regulations, or of any directions given thereunder, shall be moored at the place fixed as a mooring station, and referred to in Article II hereof, or which shall be on its way thither.

SOUTH ATLANTIC OCEAN.

Iceberg Reported in Lat. 44° 56' S.,

Long. 60° 10' W.

WITH reference to recent Notices to Mariners, on Icebergs in the South Atlantic Ocean:—

Information has been received from Mr. H. G. Moore, commanding the British steamship "Milton," that on 17th June, when in approximately lat. 44° 56' S., long. 60° 15' W., a large iceberg was seen about five miles to the eastward. The position of this berg is much to the westward of any yet reported, and it appears probable that other bergs may have drifted towards the Coast of South America, from the large fields of ice islands and bergs, described in the Notices to Mariners.

The position above given lies in the direct track to Magellan Strait from the northward, Mariners therefore navigating in the vicinity should use caution.

*Rocky Ledge Reported South-west of Cape
St. Elias.*

THE United States Government has given notice, dated 15th July, 1893, that the American barque "Sea Ranger" was wrecked on a ledge of rocks, stated as lying with Cape St. Elias (Hammond Point), the south extreme of Kaye (Kaya) Island, bearing approximately N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., distant $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles. The only sounding taken was $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms.

Wolf Trap Spit—Alteration in Lights, &c.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 322 of 1893, and previous Notices:—

The United States Government has given further notice, that on or about 31st July, 1893, the steam tender "Holly," previously moored off the side of Wolf Trap Lighthouse, west shore of Chesapeake Bay, would be replaced by Light-vessel No. 46:—

This light-vessel shows two fixed white lights (catoptric), one at each masthead; they are elevated 45 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles.

The vessel has two masts, is schooner rigged, but no bowsprit. The hull is red, with "Wolf Trap No. 46" in large white letters and figures on her sides. The mastheads are white, and at each there is a red cage work daymark.

Approximate position on Admiralty Charts, lat. $37^{\circ} 23' 25'' N.$, long. $76^{\circ} 10' 40'' W.$

Also, that during thick or foggy weather, a 12-inch steam whistle on board this light-vessel will be sounded as follows:—Blast five seconds, silence ten seconds, blast five seconds, followed by silence for ninety seconds. Should the whistle be disabled, a bell will be struck by hand.

UNITED STATES—MARYLAND.—POTOMAC RIVER.

(1.) *Cob Point Lighthouse—Sector of Red Light.*

THE United States Government has given notice, that on or about 15th August, 1893, a sector of fixed red light will be shown from Cob Point Lighthouse, north shore of Potomac River. This sector will be visible through an arc of about 11° , or between the bearings of E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. (S. $69^{\circ} E.$) and S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. (S. $58^{\circ} E.$), and will cover a part of Kettle Bottom Shoals. The south edge of this sector will cut Tenth Mid Channel Buoy (black and white vertical stripes)

off Bluff Point, and intersect the south-west edge of the sector of red light to be shown (about 15th August) from Lower Cedar Point Lighthouse, a little south-east of that buoy.

Approximate position, lat. $38^{\circ} 14\frac{1}{2}' N.$, long. $76^{\circ} 49\frac{1}{2}' W.$

(2.) *Lower Cedar Point Lighthouse—Increased
Arc of Red Light.*

Also, that on or about 15th August, 1893, the arc of the sector of red light shown from Lower Cedar Point Light, west shore of Potomac River, will be increased, so that its south-west edge will be shown on a N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.
