By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT, Sir George Trevelyan. Mr. J. B. Balfour.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the fourth, chapter seventy-eight, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that it shall and " may be lawful for the Lords and others of His " Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of "them, to make such Order as they shall see "necessary and expedient upon any unforeseen " emergency, or in any particular case or cases, " with respect to any vessel arriving and having any infectious disease or distemper on board, or on board of which any infectious disease or "distemper may have appeared in the course of "the voyage, or arriving under any other alarm-"ing or suspicious circumstances as to infection, " although such vessel shall not have come from "any place from which His Majesty, His Heirs " and successors, by and with the advice of His " Privy Council, may have adjudged and declared "it probable that the Plague, or any such in-"fectious disease or distemper may be brought, " and also with respect to the persons, goods, "wares, and merchandise, and other articles, as " aforesaid, on board the same; and in case of "any infectious disease or distemper appearing or breaking out in the United Kingdom or "the islands aforesaid, to make such Orders "and give such direction, in order to cut off all "communication between any persons infected " with any such disease or distemper, and the rest " of His Majesty's subjects, as shall appear to the "Lords or others of His Majesty's Privy Council, " or any two or more of them, to be necessary " and expedient for that purpose, and likewise to " make such Orders as they shall see fit for "shortening the time of quarantine to be per-"formed by particular vessels or particular " persons, goods, wares, merchandise, or any other "articles, or for absolutely or conditionally releas-"ing them, or any of them, from quarantine; " and all such Orders so made by the Lords or " others of the Privy Council, or any two or more " of them, as aforesaid, shall be as good, valid, " and effectual, to all intents and purposes, as well "with respect to the Commander, Master, or " other person, having the charge of any vessel, "and all other persons on board the same, as "with respect to any other persons having any intercourse or communication with them, and to "the penalties, forfeitures, and punishments to "which they may respectively become liable, as "any Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His heirs, and successors, by and with the advice of His or their Privy Council, concerning quarantine, notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette:"

And whereas by "The Public Health (Scotland)
Act, 1867;" it is (among other things) enacted

(section fifty-six) as follows:-

"Every ship having on board any person affected with a dangerous or infectious disorder " shall be deemed to be within the provisions of "the Act of the sixth year of King George the "Fourth, chapter seventy-eight, intituled 'An "'Act to repeal the several laws relating to "' Quarantine and to make other provisions in "' lieu thereof,' although such ship has not com-"menced the voyage, or has come from or is " bound for some place in the United Kingdom; " and nothing in this Act contained shall interfere " with or prevent the execution of any orders, "regulations, or restrictions to be made by the "Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy "Council pursuant to the said Act; and any "expenses incurred by any Local Authority in " carrying into effect such orders, regulations, or "restrictions, shall be deemed to be expenses "incurred by them in carrying into effect this Act; and all penalties imposed by the said Act " of the sixth year of King George the Fourth, "chapter seventy-eight, may be reduced by the Justices or Court having jurisdiction in "respect of such penalties, to such sum as the "Justices or Court think just."

And whereas the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by Orders bearing date the twelfth day of July and the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eightythree, did make certain rules, orders, and regulations.

And whereas it is expedient that, in place of the rules and regulations made by the said Orders, other rules and regulations as hereinafter contained should be made.

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the recited enactments or otherwise in them vested, do hereby rescind all such rules, orders, and regulations in the above-recited Orders contained which apply to Scotland,

except in so far as they may apply to any proceedings now pending, and they do hereby order as follows:-

Definitions.

ART. 1. In this Order—
The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat:

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs;

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship;

term "Cholera" includes Choleraic

Diarrhea; The term "Board of Supervision" has the same meaning as in the Public Health (Scot-

land) Act, 1867;
The term "Local Authority" has the same meaning as in the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1867, as amended by the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889.

The term "Medical Officer of Health" includes any duly qualified Medical Practitioner appointed by a Local Authority to act in the execution of this Order;

For the purposes of this Order,-

Every ship shall be deemed infected with Cholera in which there is or has been during the voyage, or during the stay of such ship in a port in the course of such voyage, any case of Cholera.

I.—Regulations as to Detention by Officers of Customs.

ART. 2. If any Officer of Customs, on the arrival of any ship, ascertain from the master of such ship or otherwise, or have reason to suspect, that the ship is infected with Cholera, he shall detain such ship, and order the master forthwith to moor or anchor the same in such position as such Officer of Customs shall direct; and thereupon the master shall forthwith moor or anchor the ship accordingly.

ART. 3. Whilst such ship shall be so detained,

no person shall leave the same.

ART. 4. The Officer of Customs detaining any ship as aforesaid, shall forthwith give notice thereof, and of the cause of such detention, to the Local Authority of the place to which the ship shall be bound, or where the ship shall be about to call.

ART. 5. Such detention by the Officer of Customs shall cease as soon as the ship shall have been duly visited and examined by the Medical Officer of Health; or, if the ship shall, upon such examination, be found to be infected with Cholera, as soon as the same shall be moored or anchored in pursuance of Article 10 of this Order.

Provided, that if the examination be not commenced within twelve hours after notice given as aforesaid, the ship shall, on the expiration of the said twelve hours, be released from detention.

II .- Regulations as to Local Authorities.

ART. 6. Every Local Authority within whose district persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming foreign shall, as speedily as practicable, and from time to time with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Local Authority where any ship may be moored or anchored, for the purpose of Article 10; and shall make provision for the reception of Cholera patients and persons suffering from illness removed under Articles 13 and 14.

In the case of any Local Authority within whose district or jusisdiction there is in the opinion

of Customs of the Port no place where a ship can be moored or anchored safely or suitably for the purpose of this Article, such Local Authority may fix some place without such jurisdiction or district, but as near thereto as possible, wherein a ship may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 hereof. Provided that no such place shall be fixed without the consent of the Local Authority within whose jurisdiction or district the said place is situate, and that in the event of such consent being refused the firstmentioned Local Authority may in their discretion, refer the matter to the Board of Supervision, whose decision on any or all the points in dispute (without prejudice to any other course provided by law) shall be final; and any expenses incurred by either Local Authority in carrying into effect the provisions of this Article shall be chargeable to the Local Authority for whom such place of anchorage is provided within the terms of this Article.

Provided also that where in pursuance of either of the above-recited Orders places have been duly fixed for the mooring or anchoring of ships, such places shall be deemed to have been so fixed in pursuance of this Order.

ART. 7. The Local Authority, on notice being given to them by an Officer of Customs under this Order, shall forthwith cause the ship in regard to which such notice shall have been given, to be visited and examined by their Medical Officer of Health for the purpose of ascertaining whether she is infected with Cholera.

ART. 8. The Medical Officer of Health if he have reason to believe that any ship coming or being within the jurisdiction or district of the Local Authority, whether examined by the Officer of Customs or not, is infected with Cholera, or if she shall have come from a place infected with Cholera, may visit and examine such ship, for the purpose of ascertaining whether she is so infected; and the Master of such ship shall permit the same to be so visited and examined.

ART. 9. If the Medical Officer of Health on making such examination as aforesaid (whether under Article 7 or 8), shall be of opinion that the ship is infected, he shall forthwith give a certificate in duplicate in the following Form, or to the like effect, and shall deliver one copy to the Master and retain the other or transmit it to the Local Authority.

(Signed) Medical Officer of Health [or Medical Practitioner appointed by the Local Authority.] He shall also give to the Board of Supervision information as to the arrival of the ship, or such other particulars as that Board may require.

ART. 10. The master of every ship so certified to be infected with Cholera shall thereupon moor or anchor her at the placed fixed for that purpose under Article 6, and she shall remain there until the requirements of this Order have been duly fulfilled.

ART. 11. No person shall leave any such ship until the examination hereinafter mentioned shall have been made.

ART. 12. The Medical Officer of Health shall, as soon as possible after any such ship has been certified to be infected with Cholera, examine of the Local Authority and of the Chief Officer | every person on board of the same, and in the case of any person suffering from Cholera or from any illness which the Medical Officer of Health suspects may prove to be Cholera, shall certify accordingly; and no person who shall not be so certified shall be permitted to land unless he satisfy the Medical Officer of Health as to his name, place of destination, and address at such place.

The name and address of any such person shall forthwith be given by the Medical Officer to the clerk to the Local Authority, and such clerk shall thereupon transmit the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destina-

tion of such person is situate.

ART. 13. Every person certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from Cholera, shall be dealt with under any regulations that may have been made by the Local Authority under Section 55 of the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1867; or, where no such regulations shall have been made, shall be removed, if the condition of the patient admit of it, to some hospital or place appointed for that purpose by the said Authority; and no person so removed shall leave such hospital or place until the Medical Officer of Health shall have certified that such person is free from the said disease.

If any person suffering from Cholera cannot be removed, the ship shall remain subject, for the purposes of this Order, to the control of the Medical Officer of Health; and the infected person shall not be removed from or leave the ship, except with the consent in writing of the Medical Officer of Health.

ART. 14. Any person certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from any illness which such Officer suspects may prove to be Cholera, may either be detained on board the ship for any period not exceeding two days, or be taken to some hospital or other place previously appointed by the Local Authority, and detained there for a like period, in order that it may be ascertained whether the illness is or is not Cholera.

Any such person who, while so detained, shall be certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from Cholera, shall be dealt with as provided by Article 13 of this Order.

ART. 15. The Medical Officer of Health shall in the case of every ship certified to be infected, give directions, and take such steps as may appear to him to be necessary, for preventing the spread of infection, and the Master of the said ship shall forthwith carry into execution such directions as shall be so given to him.

ART. 16. In the event of any death from Cholera taking place on board of such ship while so detained, the Master shall as directed by the Local Authority or the Medical Officer of Health either cause the dead body to be taken out to sea, and committed to the deep, properly loaded to prevent its rising, or shall deliver it into the charge of the said Authority for interment, and the Authority shall thereupon have the same interred.

ART. 17. The Master shall cause any articles that may have been soiled with Cholera discharges to be destroyed, and the clothing and bedding and other articles of personal use likely to retain infection which have been used by any person who may have suffered from Cholera on board such ship, or who, having left such ship, shall have suffered from Cholera during the stay of such ship in any Port, to be disinfected or (if necessary) destroyed; and if the Master shall have neglected to do so before the ship arrives in Port, he shall forthwith, or upon the direction of the Local .

Authority, or the Medical Officer of Health, cause the same to be disinferted or destroyed, as the case may require; and if the said Master neglect to comply with such direction within a reasonable time, the Authority shall cause the same to be carried into execution.

ART. 18. The Master shall cause the ship to be disinfected, and every article therein, other than those last described, which may probably be infected with Cholera, to be disinfected or destroyed, according to the directions of the

Medical Officer of Health.

ART. 19. If the Medical Officer of Health have reason to believe that any ship coming or being within the district or jurisdiction of the Local Authority is infected with Cholera, he may direct the bilge water to be pumped out before such ship enters any dock or basin; and on the Local Authority providing a proper supply of water for drinking and cooking purposes for persons on board the ship, he may direct all casks or tanks on board the ship containing water for the use of such persons to be emptied and cleansed, and the Master shall cause the said directions to be carried into effect.

III.—Flag to be hoisted by Ships infected with Cholera.

ART. 20. The Master of every ship infected with Cholera shall, when within three miles of the coast of any part of Scotland, cause to be hoisted the Commercial Code Signal Q, being a yellow flag, under the National Ensign, and shall keep the same displayed during the whole of the time between sunrise and sunset.

-Additional Articles applicable to a Ship not infected with Cholera, but which has come from a place infected with Cholera, or has Passengers on Board who are in a fil hy or otherwise unwholesome condition.

ART. 21. Where a ship is not infected with Cholera, but has passengers on board who are in a filthy or otherwise unwholesome condition, or has come from a place infected with Chalera, the Medical Officer may, if in his opinion it is desirable with a view to checking the introduction or spread of Cholera, give a certificate in duplicate in the following form, or to the like effect, and shall deliver one to the Master, and retain the other or transmit it to the Local Authority:-

ART. 22. When such certificate has been given, no person on board the ship shall leave or be allowed to leave the same unless he satisfy the Medical Officer as to his name, place of destination, and address at such place, and such name and address shall forthwith be given by the Medical Officer to the clerk to the Local Authority, and such clerk shall thereupon transmit the same to the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination of such person is situate.

ART. 23. If the Medical Officer have reason to

believe that any ship coming or being within the jurisdiction of the Local Authority has come from a place infected with Cholera, he may direct the bilge water to be pumped out before such ship enters any dock or basin; and on the Local Authority providing a proper supply of water for drinking and cooking purposes for persons on board the ship, he may direct all casks or tanks on board the ship containing water for the us: of such persons to be emptied and cleansed, and the Master shall cause the said directions to be carried into effect.

ART. 24. The right of an Officer of Customs to detain a ship infected with Cholera, in terms of Part I of this Order, shall apply to a ship not infected with Cholera, but which has come from a place infected with Cholera, or has passengers on board who are in a filthy or otherwise unwholesome condition. THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 8th September, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Christiania, enclosing the following Norwegian Quarantine

In pursuance of the Law of June 26th, 1893, concerning measures to be taken for preventing the introduction of the Asiatic cholera, and in virtue of a Royal Decree of July 14th last the following measures are prescribed:

1. Persons who, from a foreign district infected . or declared to be infected with cholera, arrive in . Norway by land or by sea, shall, on arrival at their place of destination in this country, as well as at any place where during their journey they pass the night, or where in the course of the first five days' after their arrival in this country they make a longer stay than twelve hours, immediately report themselves to the Local Board of Health or to the Inspector selected by the same for the The report may be given direct or purpose. through the person lodging the traveller.

2. Everybody who lodges travellers shall,

immediately after the arrival of travellers, who

in the course of the last five days have arrived in this country from a foreign district infected or declared to be infected with cholera, give notice to the Local Board of Health or to the Inspector selected. This notice shall contain the particulars claimed in section 3 beneath.

3. Every keeper of hotels, inns, or lodginghouses shall be bound to procure a register or book authorized by the Police Officer concerned, where he has to enter the names of all the travellers that they each day receive as lodgers, their social position, homestead, sojourn at a place infected with cholera (stating both the place and the time for their last stay at such place), the day of their arrival in Norway, the day of their arrival at and departure from the hotel, inn, or lodging-house, their next place of destination, as well as the date of the notice given by the landlord to the President of the Board of Health, or to the Inspector.

These prescriptions shall come into force directly.

According to section 2 of the said law, everybody who withdraws, or tries to withdraw from these prescriptions, shall be subject to a penalty of 2-1,000 crowns or to imprisonment, inasmuch. as no heavier penalty may be applied to the case.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Sanitary Notice issued by the Danish Government. The following is a translation thereof :-

For the present there is no quarantine.

A. The regulations in section 21 of the Law regarding precautions against the introduction of infectious diseases into the kingdom, of the 2nd July, 1880, are in force as regards the following places:

Naples, London, Russian ports in the Baltic and the Gulf of Finland, all Dutch ports, all Belgian ports, all French ports, all ports in Egypt, ports in Tonquin and Cochin China, as well as the East Indies, including the Dutch East Indian Colonies, ports in the Red Sea, Japan, ports in Syria, and ports in the Black Sea and the Sea of Azov.

B. Prohibition regarding importation and advice regarding disinfection:

As at present no rags may be imported from Russia, Finland, or Germany, so for the future none may be brought from Holland, Belgium, France, Japan, and Italy, or from all the places mentioned under letter A, with the exception of London. It is also prohibited to import wool-scrapings from the abovenamed countries and places, so far as there is not sent with them a legalised proof that they have been carbonised or washed and heated to a temperature of 80° Celsius.

It is further prohibited to import from any of the places mentioned above, with the exception of London, dirty linen, dirty clothes, and dirty bedclothes, unless as travelling luggage, or else under a written statement from the Receiver that these objects are entering the country solely as a necessary part of the possessor's change of abode. But even in such cases as those in which by the above regulation these articles can be introduced into Denmark, they can be retained, if there is any reason to suspect them of being in any way dangerous, until they have been publicly disinfected.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order dated the 5th day of August, 1893, made certain Regulations prescribing that from and after the 9th day of August, 1893, and until We should by Order otherwise direct, no dirty bedding, or disused or filthy clothing, whether belonging to emigrants or otherwise. from France or from any foreign Port in Europe north of Dunkirk, other than Ports of Sweden, Norway, and Denmark, or from any Port on the

Black Sea or Sea of Azov, whether in Russia, Roumania, Bulgaria, or Turkey, or from any other Port of Turkey in Asia, shall be delivered overside, except for the purpose of disinfection or destruction, nor landed in any port or place in England or Wales, except for the purpose of disinfection or destruction;

And whereas in Article 1 of such Order the terms "Bedding" and Clothing" were defined as including such articles when torn up, but not including Rags packed in bales and imported as merchandise;

And whereas doubts have arisen as to the meaning of the words "Rags packed in bales and imported as merchandise";

And whereas the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs have signified their consent to the Regulation herein contained so far as the

same apply to the Officers of Customs:

Now therefore, We do, by this Our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, by the Public Health Act, 1889, and by Section 113 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and of every other power enabling Us in this behalf, make the following Regulation, and declare as follows:—

The above-mentioned words "Rags packed in bales and imported as merchandise" mean Rags compressed by hydraulic force transported as wholesale merchandise in bales surrounded by iron bands, and with marks and numbers showing their origin, and accepted as such by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs.

Salford Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Salford
Union, in the County Borough of Salford
and the County of Lancaster;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Salford Union (among others), it was required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, should be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Memoer thereof, who should enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas by an Order issued by Us, the Local Government Board, and dated the 1st day of August, 1882, similar requirements were made with respect to certain Accounts prescribed by that Order for the Infirmary of the said Union;

And whereas by a further Order dated the 14th day of July, 1883, We authorised the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union to appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as set forth in such Order;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision in the matter should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I .- It shall be the duty of the Stocktaker appointed by the Guardians of the Poor of the said Salford Union, under the authority of the said Order dated the fourteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in addition to the duties to be performed by him under such Order, to examine, at such periods and on such occasions as the said Guardians may require, the Inventories at the Workhouse and the Infirmary of the said Union, and to compare the same with the stock in store thereat; and, at any time when so required by the said Guardians, to examine any of the stock or other property belonging to the said Guardians at the said Workhouse or Infirmary, and compare the same with the Stock Accounts which the Master of the Workhouse or the Steward of the Infirmary are required by the said Guardians to keep.

ARTICLE II.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article I. of this Order, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of the Account in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this day of "189, and found to be correct as "regards the quantities of stock remaining in "store.

" (Signed) _____" Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE III.—The Master of the said Workhouse and the Steward of the said Infirmary shall, when required by the said Stocktaker to do so, submit to him the Inventories, Accounts and Stores referred to in Article I. of this Order, and otherwise render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of the performance by him of the duties prescribed by Article I. hereof.

ARTICLE IV.—The Master of the Workhouse or the Steward of the Infirmary, as the case may be, shall lay every Account certified by the Stocktaker under Article II. hereof before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of the said certificate.

West Derby Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the West Derby Union, in the County of Lancaster and the County Boroughs of Bootle and Liverpool;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes and to the

Overseers of the Poor of the several Townships comprised in the said Union ;-And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 13th day of November, 1856, the Poor Law Board empowered the Guardians of the Poor of the said West Derby Union to form Committees of themselves and from time to time to assign to any such Committee the whole or part of the District of any of the Relieving Officers of the said Union in order that such Committee might hear and determine all applications for relief on account of poor persons residing or being in the District or part of a District so assigned to such Committee, and might give all directions respecting the continuance of relief to poor persons belonging to such District or part of a District, in such manner as the said Guardians, acting as a Board, were or might be authorised to do ;

And whereas by a General Order dated the 5th day of September, 1877, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said West Derby Union, among others, We, the Local Government Board, empowered the said Guardians to authorise the said Relief Committees to deal with all applications for payment of School Fees on account of parents, not being paupers, residing or being in the Districts or parts of Districts which might have

been assigned to such Committees;

And whereas it is expedient that other provision should be made for the appointment of Committees for the purpose of hearing and determining applications for relief by paupers belonging to the said Union, and of dealing with the applications made by parents, not being paupers, for payment of School Fees, whether such lastmentioned applications are made directly to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union or through an Inquiry Officer:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby rescind the above-cited Order dated the thirteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and the above-cited General Order in so far as it relates to the said West Derby Union, and We Order that the following regulations shall be substituted in lieu

thereof; that is to say,—
ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Union may at any ordinary meeting appoint one or more Committee or Committees, hereinafter termed the Relief Committee or Relief Committees, each consisting of not less than three Guardians, and may from time to time assign to any such Relief Committee the whole or part of the District of any of the Relieving Officers of the said Union.

ARTICLE II.—Every Relief Committee shall meet at the same place as is appointed for the Meetings of the Guardians, or at such other place as the Guardians may, with Our approval, appoint,

and at such times as the Guardians shall appoint.

ARTICLE III.—Every Relief Committee shall at every Meeting appoint one of themselves to preside as Chairman at that Meeting, and shall cause Minutes of their proceedings to be kept in a Book to be provided for that purpose by the The Minute Book of each Board of Guardians. Committee shall be laid before the said Board of Guardians at each of their ordinary meetings.

ARTICLE IV.—Any Relief Committee appointed may hear and determine all applications for relief on account of poor persons residing or being in the District or part of the District which may have been so assigned to them, and may give all directions respecting the continuance of relief to poor persons belonging to such District or part

of the District, in such manner as the Guardians, of the Union, acting as a Board, are now or may hereafter be authorised to do; but an order for relief given by any such Committee shall not be valid unless a majority of the Members of the Committee then present concur in such relief, nor unless three Members, at least, be present when such order is made.

ARTICLE V.—The Guardians of the Union may if they think fit to do so, authorise any Relief Committee appointed as aforesaid to deal with all applications for payment of School Fees on account of parents, not being paupers, resident or being in the District or part of the District which may have been so assigned to such Committee; and such Committee shall thereupon hear and determine all such applications and give all directions respecting the continuance of the payment of the Fees in such manner as the Guardians, acting as a Board, are now or may hereafter be authorised to do.

ARTICLE VI.—Nothing contained in this Order shall at any time prevent the Guardians, acting as a Board, from rescinding or altering any order of a Relief Committee in regard to relief not previously administered or to School Fees not previously paid, or from considering and deciding on any application for relief from any poor person or any application for payment of School Fees on account of any parent as aforesaid, or from determining on the continuance or cossation of any weekly or other allowance of relief which shall not have been actually given or any weekly or other Fee which shall not have been actually paid.

ARTICLE VII.-Every Relieving Officer or Inquiry Officer, as the case may be, whose District or any part thereof is assigned to a Relief Committee shall submit to the Committee at every

In the case of an application for relief, the Application and Report Book, which he is required to keep by the General Order of the Poor Law Board dated the 14th day of January, 1867; and

In the case of an application for the payment of School Fees as aforesaid, the School Fees Application and Report Book, which he is required to keep by the General Order of the Local Government Board dated the 22nd day of

March, 1877:

And with respect to every such application, either for relief or for payment of School Fees, a note of the decision or direction of the Committee thereon, whether the application be made directly to the Committee or through the Relieving Officer or Inquiry Officer, shall be inserted at the Meeting of the Committee in the proper columns of the Application and Report Book or the School Fees Application and Report Book, as the case may be, and authenticated in the proper column by the initials of one of the Members of the Committee or of the Clerk to the Board of Guardians.

ARTICLE VIII .- A Relief Order Book according to the Form prescribed by the said General Order of the Poor Law Board dated the 14th day of January, 1867, and a School Fees Order Book according to the Form prescribed by the said General Order of the Local Government Board dated the 22nd day of March, 1877. shall be kept for the use of each Relief Committee, and the first four columns in each of such books shall, as far as practicable, be entered up by the Clerk before each Meeting of the Committee, and the remaining columns in each book, containing the particulars of the decisions or directions of the Committee, shall be filled up at the Meeting by
