And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission We do, by these presents, give and grant unto you, or any five or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to, and examine, all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject; and to enquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means

whatsoever.

And we do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any inquiry which you may hold.

And We do further by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to

time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the questions herein submitted for your consideration.

Translation of Circular No. 8872, from the Imperial Royal Marine Board at Trieste, to all the Imperial Royal Offices and Subordinate Sani-

tary Offices and Port Officers.

THE High Imperial Royal Minister for Commerce, by Decree, dated September 4, 1893, No. 45348, has determined that, with reference to the Rules of the "International Sanitary Convention of Dresden," and to present sanitary conditions, the medical observation of seven days against arrivals from the Russian ports of the Black Sea, from the Sea of Azov, from the Baltic, and from the Danube, as well as the strict medical visit for arrivals from the coast of Syria (from Jaffa to Berout), from Northern France, from Belgium, Netherlands, from the German ports (the mouth of the Elbe included), from the stretch of coast between Cape Jeros-Burum and Batoum (this last port included), and from the Turkish ports of the Black Sea, is hereby annulled.

Ordering, at the same time, that arrivals from the ports in South Russia (and especially in Podolia and Bessarabia), where it is to be pre-sumed there exists still the possibility of infection, are to be treated according to the rules agreed upon at the "International Convention of

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 17th August, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Rio de Janeiro, reporting that that day's "Diario Official" publishes a Notice prohibiting from the 16th instant, until further notice, the entry into Brazil of immigrants from Italy or any other country where cholera has been officially declared to exist by the Brazilian Government. At the same time it is stated that the port of Naples which was previously declared to be "suspected" is now considered "infected" with cholera-morbus.

The other ports which are, according to a statement published in the "Diario Official" of the 16th August, at present considered infected are those of Russia and Senegambia.
