THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Representative at Therapia a Despatch, dated 2nd instant, intimating that the twenty-four hours' observation on arrivals from the Mediterranean ports of France and Monaco is re-imposed, that the quarantine against Nicolariëff is increased to six days, and that the quarantine of three days at Mustapha Pacha and Zibefteche on arrivals by land is increased to five days.

THE Board of Trade have received, from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid, a

Telegram, dated 11th instant, announcing free pratique to arrivals from Mogador, Morocco, which left after 23rd September. Also a notice, intimating that ports within 165 kilometres of Phillipeville (Algeria) are considered dangerously affected since 19th September. The free pratique allowed to arrivals from Rio de Janeiro and Santos is extended to ports within 165 kilometres of those places if they arrive with clean bills of health viséd by a Spanish Consul, or failing such by a Consul of another nation, and provided that they do not infringe any of the rules in existence, and that they arrive in good hygienic condition, and without suspicious occurrence in the health of the ship.

THE Board of Trade have received the following Notice as to quarantine, issued by the Government of Greece, viz.:—

ART. 4. Ships proceeding from cholera-infected countries shall be liable to an effective quarantine of ten days, if their voyage lasted less than twenty days.

If their voyage lasted twenty full days, they will be submitted to an effective quarantine of five days.

If their voyage lasted more than twenty days and less than twenty-five days, they shall complete twenty-five days.

This supplementary quarantine shall be always performed at a lazaretto unless it does not exceed four days, in which case it is permitted in every
