THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Representative at Alexandria the following information respecting quarantine:—

Regulations respecting return pilgrimage suppressed, ordinary quarantine against cholera imposed against arrivals from all ports on Arabian coast of Red Sea.

Quarantine imposed against Leghorn and Messina. Arrivals must complete seven full days from time of departure from these ports.

"Dutch ports suspected of cholera in Notice 583 (see Gazette of 29th August) declared to be infected from 15th August."

THE Board of Trade have received a Notice, issued by the Spanish Government, and dated

10th instant, containing the following information respecting quarantine, viz:—

Arrivals from Blyth (England) which left after 23rd ultimo will be dispatched to a foul lazaretto whatever their bill of health. Ports within 165 kilometres of Blyth considered dangerously affected from the 4th instant, inclusive.

Arrivals from Stockholm declared foul from 24th ultimo, and ports within 165 kilometres dangerously affected from 5th instant, inclusive.

Arrivals from Ternenzen (Netherlands) declared clean from the 4th instant; arrivals from thence as well as from ports within 165 kilometres of that port admitted to free pratique if they arrive with clean bills of health, viséd by a Spanish Consul, or failing such by that of another nation, in good hygienic conditions and without suspicious occurrences on board, and provided that they do not infringe any of the existing regulations.

Infectious goods laid down in the Royal Order of the 29th October, 1886, which remained in Ternenzen during the epidemic, and leave from the 25th instant, inclusive, shall likewise be admitted without disinfection, if they arrive in good hygienic condition.

THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Representative at Athens the following Telegram, dated 13th instant:—

"Quarantine on arrivals from Italian ports between Venice and Santa Maria di Leuca, inclusive, reduced to forty-eight hours, and from Tunisian ports to five days."

THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Representative at Lisbon the following Telegram, dated 14th instant, viz:—
"Dakar declared infected with cholera from September 8."

Also a Notice issued by the Portuguese Government, declaring the port of Stettin infected with cholera from 15th September last, and the port of Blyth infected with same disease from 1st instant, and all other ports in Northumberland, with the exception of Newcastle, which continues to be infected, suspected of the same disease from the same date.
