

1. To enable the Company to extend and enlarge their existing Gas Works at Ilford, in the county of Essex, and to construct, maintain, and use additional works for the manufacture, storage, and supply of gas, and for the manufacture, conversion, and utilisation of residual products, producible or resulting from the manufacture of gas upon the following lands (that is to say):

A piece of land situate in the parish of Ilford, in the county of Essex, belonging, or reputed to belong to Sir Edward Hulse, Baronet, and now leased to and occupied by the Company, bounded on the north by the High-road, on the West by the Back River, on the south by the freehold land next hereinafter described, and on the east partly by land belonging to the said Sir Edward Hulse, now in the occupation of Messrs. C. H. Binney and Co., and partly by the land on which the existing works of the Company are erected and scheduled in the Ilford Gas Order, 1873, which said piece of land contains by admeasurement two roods and four poles, or thereabouts.

Also a triangular piece of freehold land, situate in the parish of Ilford, in the county of Essex, and belonging, or reputed to belong to the Company, and now in their occupation, bounded on the north side partly by the piece of leasehold land above described, and partly by the said piece of land scheduled in the Ilford Gas Order, 1873, and on the two remaining sides by the Back River, and the River Rhoden or Roding, to where these streams form a second junction, which said piece of land contains by admeasurement four acres and fifteen poles, or thereabouts.

2. To raise further capital by the creation and issue of new shares or stock, with or without a preference or priority in payment of interest or dividend, and upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed in the intended order, and by borrowing on mortgage debenture stock, or otherwise, including a power to borrow and to create and issue debenture stock as well in respect of the existing or authorised capital as well as of the further capital to be raised under the intended Order.

3. To authorise the Company to acquire and hold patent rights and licenses in relation to the manufacture or distribution of gas, and the utilisation of the residual products obtainable therefrom, or the production by any means of artificial light.

4. To empower the Company for the general purposes of the Order and their undertaking, to acquire by agreement and to hold other lands, easements, and property.

5. To authorise the Company to manufacture, purchase, sell or let, or otherwise deal in, and fix, set up, alter, repair, maintain, remove, and refix gas and other apparatus, engines, stoves, ranges, fittings, pipes, and other appliances, articles and things for the warming, heating, lighting, or ventilating of houses, buildings and other places, and for the cooking of food, and for motive power, and all other purposes for which gas is or hereafter may be used, and to require and take such remuneration in money or such rents and charges for the sale, supply, fixing, setting up, letting or use of such apparatus, engines, stoves, fittings, pipes, and other appliances, articles, and things as aforesaid as may be agreed upon between the Company and the persons to or by whom the same are sold, let, or used, or otherwise, as may be provided by the intended Order.

6. To empower the Company to supply gas in

bulk to any corporation, local board, sanitary or other public authority, company or person, either within or beyond the Company's present limits of supply, and to enable the Company on the one hand, and any corporation, local board, sanitary or other public authority, company or person on the other hand, to make and carry into effect contracts, agreements, and arrangements for or with respect to the supply of gas in bulk or otherwise for any public trading or other purpose, and to authorise any such company, local board, sanitary or other public authority, to apply their respective funds, and to raise further moneys for the purpose of any such contract, agreement, or arrangement.

7. To incorporate with the intended Provisional Order all or some of the provisions of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; the Companies Clauses Act, 1863; the Companies Clauses Act, 1869; the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847; and the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1871: and to repeal, alter, or amend all or some of the provisions of the Deed of Settlement of the Company, dated the 24th day of July, 1839, under which the Company now carry on their business, and the Ilford Gas Orders, 1873 and 1881 respectively.

8. To vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would interfere with the powers and objects to be sought for by the intended Order, and to confer other rights and privileges.

9. On or before the 30th day of November instant, a copy of this Notice, as published in the London Gazette, together with a map or plan showing the land at present in use, and as proposed to be used, for the manufacture and storage of gas and residual products, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Essex, at his office at Chelmsford, in the same county, and at the office of the Board of Trade, Whitehall, London.

On or before the 23rd day of December aforesaid, printed copies of the draft Provisional Order will be deposited at the office of the Board of Trade, and copies of such draft Order when deposited can be obtained at the office of Mr. Edward Walmisley, 25, Abingdon-street, Westminster, on payment of 1s. for each copy.

Any Company, Corporation, or person desirous of making any representation to the Board of Trade, or of bringing before them any objection respecting the application may do so by letter addressed to the Assistant Secretary of the Railway Department of the Board of Trade, at the office aforesaid, on or before the 15th day of January next ensuing, and copies of such objections must at the same time be also sent to the promoters, or to the Parliamentary Agent acting on their behalf, as undermentioned, and in forwarding to the Board of Trade any such representation or objection, the objectors or their agents must state that a copy of the same has been forwarded to the promoters or their agent.

The Provisional Order, if and when granted by the Board of Trade, will be published in the same local newspaper as this notice, and printed copies thereof will be deposited for public inspection at the beforementioned office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Essex, and copies will be supplied to all persons applying for them at the office, and on the terms beforementioned.
