of a Government Notice issued by Her Majesty's
Representative at Malta, whereby Government
Notice No. 181, of 18th November, 1893, is
modified as follows, viz. :—

Quarantine for ten days to be reckoned from
the commencement of the voyage, with provision
for handling cargo in quarantine.

The following shall be subject to a period of
ten days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under
the directions of the Collector of Customs, to dis-
charge goods (which are not susceptible of com-
municating contagion) by means of the vessel's
crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo
local labourers, subject to ten days' quarantine,
viz. :—

(a.) Vessels arriving from any port without a
clean bill of health.

(b.) Vessels arriving from Sicily and other
Italian islands (Sardinia excepted), Turkey in
Europe in the Black Sea, Roumania, Russia in
the Black Sea and Sea of Azov, ports in the Dar-
danelles, Sea of Marmora, and the Bosphorus,
Smyrna, Scio, Chesmé, Vilayet of Tripoli, Regency
of Tunis and Algeria.

HORSMONDEN FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Justices for the Petty Sessional Division of Cranbrook, in the county of Kent, that a Fair has been annually held on the 26th and 27th days of July, in the parish of Horsmonden, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871:"

And whereas on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fair which has been annually held on the 26th and 27th days of July, in the parish of Horsmonden, in the Cranbrook Petty Sessional Division of the county of Kent, shall be abolished as from the date of this Order.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889; and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893; and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The sale or exposure for sale of any cattle sheep or swine in or at the Cattle Market at Petersfield in the county of Southampton is hereby prohibited.

2. If a head of cattle or a sheep or a pig is sold or exposed for sale in or at the said Market at Petersfield in contravention of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier thereof, and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle and of each sheep or pig so sold or exposed, and the person so selling or exposing the same, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting a sale of cattle sheep or swine at such Market, and the purchaser thereof of any cattle sheep or swine so sold or exposed in contravention of this Order, such purchaser knowing the animal to be sold or exposed for sale in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.
