

NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, December 2, 1893.

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested therein, that preparations are now being made for the intended distribution of prize money awarded for a canoe and one slave captured on the 17th October, 1892, by Her Majesty's ship "Racoon."
