SOUTH ATLANTIC OCEAN.

Ice Islands and Bergs.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners of the 29th May, 1893, on Ice Islands and Bergs in the South Atlantic Ocean:—

Mariners are warned that reports are still being made of the existence of icebergs within the boundary line marked on the diagram attached to that notice; which diagram is reprinted, with additions to this date, for the information of seamen. This boundary line roughly stretches from lat. 55° S., long. 53° W., to lat. 40° S., long. 43° W.; and then to lat. 37° S., long. 20° W. To eastward of it is ice.

Also:—Information has been received that the Masters of two vessels, just arrived at Falmouth, report having passed an ice-island, ten miles long and 300 feet high, a few miles south of Cape Horn, and directly in the track of vessels.

Ice in this latter position is absolutely unknown, and must be looked upon as a great danger.

Theodosia (Kaffa) Lights on Western Mole in Course of Construction.

THE Russian Government has given notice, dated 22nd November, 1893, that a mole is in course of construction in an easterly direction
