HER Majesty has been pleased by Her Order in Council of the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, to direct that new Letters Patent (to be made and sealed for the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Isle of Man) be granted to Edward Davies and the Patent Exhaust Steam Injector Company Limited, of No. 4, St. Ann's-square, Manchester, in the county of Lancaster (as equitable owners), for the term of seven years, for the invention of "Improvements in apparatus for feeding locomotive and other steam boilers or generators, applicable also for raising and forcing liquids for other purposes," in extension of Letters Patent (No. 316) granted to the said Edward Davies, for the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Channel Islands, and bearing date the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.
