## By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The sale or exposure for sale of any cattle sheep or swine on or at the Wong at Horncastle in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, is hereby prohibited.

2. If a head of cattle or a sheep or a pig is sold or exposed for sale on or at the Wong at Horncastle in contravention of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier thereof, and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle and of each sheep or pig so sold or exposed, and the person so selling or exposing the same, and the auctioncer, if any, or other person conducting a sale of cattle sheep or swine at the Wong aforesaid, and the purchaser thereat of any cattle sheep or swine so sold or exposed in contravention of this Order, such purchaser knowing the animal to be sold or exposed for sale in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.
