the Court, and shall be so certified in writing to the Court by the returning officer; but for the purposes of this paragraph a person whose appointment would cause a contravention of the requirement, that one at least of the persons representing the Head Teachers of such schools shall be a Head Mistress of one of them, shall be deemed not to be duly qualified.

7. If by reason of an equal number of votes being given to two or more persons the question arises which of them is to be certified as a member of the Court, the returning officer shall settle the question by lot, and the person certified by him shall be deemed to be duly appointed by the Head Teachers entitled to vote at the election.

8. The returning officer shall forthwith give to all persons so appointed notice of their appointment, which in the case of appointments to fill the places of persons retiring on the expiration of their term of office shall be deemed to date from that expiration.

The first appointment shall be deemed to date from the day on which the first meeting of the Court is held.

9. The returning officer at the first election shall be the Clerk of the Privy Council, and at subsequent elections shall be the Chancellor of the University or any person appointed by the Court in lieu of the Chancellor.


