Madrid, March 7.

HE Messenger that was lately sent by the Ambassador of Morocco, to give his Master an account of the Treaty he had concluded for the Exchange of the Spanish Prisoners taken at Larache, is come back with his approbation of it; By this agreement 1000 Moors, who are Slaves in this Kingdom, are to be given for 100 Spanish Officers, but the private Soldiers of that Garison are to be exchanged Man for Man. The Marquis de Leganez is on his departure for Milan to take possession of that Government, and he will carry with him Bills for a confiderable Sum of Money for the Service of the War. Large Supplies of Money are likewise remitted to Flanders. And at the ametime such care is taken to reinforce the Army in Caralonia, that we hope to give the Enemy a coniderable diversion on that side. We hear from Cading that the Spanish Men of War designed for this Sommer's Expedition are fitting out there with all imginable diligence.

Warfam, March 6. The King of Poland arrived bert with the whole Court on the#25th of the last Month: Prince James fets out this day towards the Frontiers of Silefia to meet the Princess of Neuboy, who is expected here about the 18th instant. We have advice, that the Cham of the European Tartars died lately at Budzinek, and that his Son

Sultan Galga succeeds him.

Vienna, March 22. The Count de Thun, the Emperor's Ambassador to the Crown of Poland, parted from hence on Monday last, with Orders to wait that King during the Campagne, which, as all our advices from thence affure us, he will begin very erly this year. Prince Louis of Baden is juddenly espected here from Bohemia, being defigned to command the Imperial Army in Hungary. And General Caprara is to command the Emperor's Fores on the Rhine under the Elector of Bavaria. The Sieur Kerfersfeldt, the Emperor's Principal Engoier, arrived the 1 rth inftant at Buda, where they are not only repairing the old Fortifications, but heuse removing a little Hill near the Walls of the. Town, which gave the Imperialitis great advanta-so when they belieged it. At Effeck they work with the same diligence, and have already enlarged the Ditch, repaired the Counterscarp, and raised kreal Outworks, which will be of great fecurity to the place. Vidalomicke, the Vice-ban, was encamped with his Troops at Zrin, from whence he had made an Incursion into the Enemies Quarters, and taken several Prisoners, and among them one Mehmed Arambiffa, who having about 10 years ago deferted from the Imperial Garison of Brees and turned Turk, is ordered to be empaled. Great quantities of Arms. Ammunition, and Provisions, are daily conveyed from hence down the River into Hungary, and the Boats with Ovens to bake Bread for the Army are likewise putting in order.

Ratisbonne, March 22. Upon the Memorial lately presented by the Minister of Savoy to the States of the Empire here affembled, the Branden-burg Envoy has declared, That his Mafter will fend his Royal Highness a Regiment of Foot, and maintain them at his own charge. Several other Princes have by their Ministers here likewise declared their readiness to affist him. And the Emperor will send his Royal Highness a farther Succor of his Troops now in the Empire, where they are not fo very neceffary, fince the two Circles of Suabia and Françonia have augmented their Forces to 21000 Men, who, with a confiderable Body of the Troops of Saxe Gotha, will joyn the Confederate Army on the

Francfort, March 28. The Landtgrave of Heffe is returned from the Hague to Cassel, the place of his usual Residence, and is preparing to take the Field with his Forces, which will make a Body of Sooo Men. Those of Saxony are on their march; And the rest of the Confederate Forces, that are to act on the Rhine, are in a readincs to open the Canpagne so soon as there is Forage for the Horse. They write from Strasbourg, that the Marefelial de Lorge is expected there the beginning of the next Month, being to command the French Army in Germany.

Hamburgh, March 30. The Letters from the Court of Brandenburg advise us, of his Electoral Highness's arrival at Postdom, and that he intended to be the 28th at Berian; from whence he would, after a few days, go and take a Review at Crofen of the 6000 men, which he fends to the Emperor's

affifiance in Hungary.

Cologne, March 30. The Brandenburg Troops, that marched from hence on Friday fait, are entred into Aix la Chapelle, in the place of those that are gone from thence toward Brabant. The Minster Forces lye at prefent near Gummenich, Liebnich, and Balbaufen, but so as that upon occasion they can quickly draw together. The Baron de Barfis is returned to Nus from his late Journey to Berlin, with orders to command the Brandenb of Foices quartered in this Diocess, and to put 3 or 4000 men more into Cologne, it he finds it necellary.
