WHEREAS the Honourable Evan Edward Charteris Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as Commissioner for determining the boundaries of the Wards of the borough of Doncaster, and for apportioning Councillors thereto, has transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his scheme in the following terms:-

"WHEREAS Her Majesty has been pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council and in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in Her Majesty by the Municipal Corporations Act. 1882 to fix the number of Wards into which the borough of Doncaster in the county of Yorkshire shall be divided and to order and direct that the said borough shall be divided into six Wards which Order was made on the twenty-sixth day of: August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

" And whereas on the twentieth day of September in the year last aforesaid the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Home Department did duly appoint me the Honourable Evan Edward Charteris, Barrister-at-Law for the purpose of determining the boundaries of such Wards and apportioning the number of the Councillors of the said borough among such Wards and apportioning Councillors for the Wards altered amongst the new Wards as in the said Act mentioned.

"Now I the said Evan Edward Charteris do hereby in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Act determine as hereinafter-mentioned the boundaries of the six Wards into which the said borough is to be divided which Wards are hereinafter numbered and named as follows, that is to say :-

"Ward No. 1 otherwise the North Ward,

"Ward No. 2 otherwise Saint George's Ward.

"Ward No. 3 otherwise the East Ward. " Ward No. 4 otherwise the South Ward.

"Ward No. 5 otherwise the West Ward. "Ward No. 6 otherwise the Central Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that the said . Ward No. 1 otherwise the North Ward shall comprise such portion of the old borough of Doncaster as is contained within a line drawn from the Borough Boundary on the Mill Bridge in Marshgate down Marsh-gate and French-gate to the junction of French-gate with Saint Sepulchregate down Saint Sepulchre-gate and the Balbyroad to the Borough Boundary thence following such boundary along the south-west and west side of the borough to the junction of such boundary with Marsh-gate on the Mill Bridge aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 2 otherwise Saint George's Ward shall ter as is contained within a line drawn from the Borough Boundary on the Mill Bridge in Marshgate down Marsh-gate, French-gate and High-street to the junction of the latter street with Silver-street thence in a northerly direction along Silver-street and Copley-road to the junction of Copley-road and Montague-street thence along Montague-street to Dockin Hill-road and along Dockin Hill-road to the Borough, Boundary thence along the Börough Boundary and following such boundary along the north and north-west side of the borough to the Mill Bridge in Marsh-gate aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 3 otherwise the East Ward shall comprise so much of the old borough of Doncaster as is contained within a line drawn from the Borough Boundary in a south-westerly direction down Dockin Hill-road Montague-street Copley-road and Silver-street to the junction of the latter street with Hall-gate along Hall-gate in an easterly direction to the junction of Hall-gate with Branson-street down Branson-street Chequer-lane Chequer-road to the borough boundary and following such boundary in an easterly direction along the east, north-east, and north borders of the borough to the junction of such boundary with Dockin Hill-road aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 4 otherwise the South Ward shall comprise so much of the old borough of Doncaster as is contained within a line drawn from the junction of Chequer-lane and Saint James-street down Chequer-lane and Chequer-road to the Borough Boundary and following such boundary to the extreme south-east border of the borough and thence proceeding along such boundary in a north-westerly direction along the Decoy Bank to the junction of such boundary with Green Dykelane thence in a north-easterly direction to the junction of Green Dyke-lane with Bentinckstreet along Bentinck-street on to Saint Jamesstreet thence in a north-easterly direction along Saint James street to the junction of the latter street with Chequer-lane aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 5 otherwise the West Ward shall comprise so much of the old borough of Doncaster as is contained within a line drawn from the junction of Saint James-street and Bentinck-street down Bentinckstreet to the junction of the latter street with Green Dyke-lane thence along Green Dyke-lane to the Municipal Boundary along such boundary in a south-westerly direction to the junction of such boundary with Balby-road thence in a northerly direction along Balby-road to the junction of Balby-road and Saint James-street thence along Saint James-street to the junction of the latter street with Bentinck-street aforesaid

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 6 otherwise the Central Ward shall comprise so much of the old borough of Doncaster as is contained within a line drawn from the junction of High-street with Saint Sepulchre-gate to the junction of Saint Sepulchre-gate with Saint Jamesstreet thence along Saint James-street and Bransonstreet to the junction of the latter street with Hallgate thence in a westerly direction along Hall-gate and High-street to the junction of High-street

and Saint Sepulchre-gate aforesaid.

"And I do hereby declare that whenever in the description of the boundary lines of the several Wards so set out as aforesaid any line is said to be drawn along or to or from any street road lane or path such line shall be considered to be drawn along or to or from the middle of such comprise so much of the old borough of Doncas- I street road lane or path and whenever in such
