RIVER ST. LAWRENCE.

*Intended Alterations in Period of Revolution of*

*Certain Lights.*

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada

has given notice, that on the opening of navigation

in the River St. Lawrence in the spring of

1894, the following alterations will be made in

the periods of the revolving lights shown at

Bicquette; Grande Isle, Kamouraska; and Stone

Pillar:—

1. Bicquette Island Light will attain its greatest

brilliance every forty-five seconds.
