THE Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Mr. William H. Stewardson and Mr. Nicholas Fitzgerald to superintend the transfer of lascars or other persons at Barrow-in-Furness and Manchester, respectively, and to grant the certificate required under Section 23 of the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1855 (18 and 19 Vict., cap. 91).

The fee to be paid for every lascar or other person in respect of whom such certificate is applied for is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed £5.
