AT an Extraordinary General Meeting of the abovenamed Company, duly convened, and held at the offices of North and Sons, 4, East Parade, Leeds, on the 13th day of March, 1894, the following Special Resolutions were duly passed; and at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Members of the said Company, also duly convened, and held at the same place, on the 2nd day of April, 1894, the said Resolutions were duly confirmed, namely:—

1. "That the Company be wound up voluntarily.
2. "That Walter Battle be appointed Liquidator for the purpose of winding up the affairs of the Company, with Mr. Alf Cooke, Mr. William Kettlewell, Mr. Fleming, Mr. Joseph Dixon, Mr. James Duff, and Mr. Whitehead as a Committee of Inspection.

3. "That the remuneration of the Liquidator shall be such sum as the Directors of the Company shall, at the conclusion of the liquidation, determine to be a fair amount, taking into consideration the time expended, the labour undertaken, and the expense incurred by the Liquidator and his Clerks in and about the liquidation."
