

Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant out of our common fund to the said vicarage of Christ Church, Mount Sorrel, to meet such benefaction, one other capital sum of one hundred pounds, in respect of which, so long as the same capital sum, or any part thereof, shall remain in our hands, there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage, one other yearly sum of three pounds, or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to any balance of the same capital sum which shall so remain in our hands; such lastly-mentioned yearly payment to commence as from the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this twenty-fourth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of five hundred and ninety-six pounds sterling which has been paid to us in favour of the vicarage of Reddal Hill, in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Worcester, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of Reddal Hill, to meet such benefaction, one other capital sum of five hundred and ninety-six pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to

such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Reddal Hill.
