THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked, and the Order dated the sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, prohibiting the sale or exposure for sale of any cattle sheep or swine on or at the Wong at Horncastle in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, shall be read and have effect as if the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, were substituted for the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in Article 3 of the last-mentioned Order, as the date from and immediately after which that Order shall take effect.
