No. 272.—ALL STATIONS.

ENGLAND—WEST COAST.—THE SCILLY ISLES—ST. MARY'S SOUND.

Sunken Rock south-westward of Bartholemew Ledges.

INFORMATION has been received from the Trinity House, London, of the existence of a rock, with a depth of 25 feet on it at low water springs, lying with St. Agnes Lighthouse bearing S.W. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. (S. 60° W.), distant $8\frac{1}{10}$ cables; and Round Rock S. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. (S. 20° E.).

Also, that about 20th July, 1894, a conical buoy, painted red, and named South Bartholemew, will be placed in a depth of about 36 feet at low water, close westward of this rock.

Approximate position, lat. $49^{\circ} 54' 10''$ N., long. $6^{\circ} 19' 50''$ W.

AFRICA—EAST COAST.

Bazaruto Island—Red Light on Cape Bazaruto.

THE Portuguese Government has given notice, dated 31st March, 1894, that a light is exhibited from a structure recently erected at the north end of Bazaruto Island:—

Bararuto Light is a fixed red light, elevated 98 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles. It is shown from a cylindrical iron tower with a conical top, the whole standing on a square base of masonry.

The light is stated to be visible seaward between the bearings of S. 63° W., through south to S. 27° E., and inshore over the anchorage.

Approximate position on Chart No. 648, lat. $21^{\circ} 31' S.$, long. $35^{\circ} 29\frac{1}{2}' E.$

RED SEA.

Perim Harbour—Amended Depth on Myrmidon Shoal.

THE following information, relating to Myrmidon Shoal, is the result of a recent examination by Commander A. Mostyn Field, R.N., Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Egeria":—

The blasting and dredging operations of the Perim Coal Company appear to have removed the central part of the shoal.

On the north-west portion of the shoal there is
