

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878.

(41 Vict. c. 16. s. 33.)

LIMEWASHING, &c.

Order of Secretary of State granting Special Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, section 33, provides as follows:

For the purpose of securing the observance of the requirements of this Act as to cleanliness in every factory and workshop, all the inside walls of the rooms of a factory or workshop, and all the ceilings or tops of such rooms (whether such walls, ceilings, or tops be plastered or not), and all the passages and staircases of a factory or workshop, if they have not been painted with oil or varnished once at least within seven years, shall be limewashed once at least within every fourteen months, to date from the period when last limewashed; and if they have been so painted or varnished, shall be washed with hot water and soap once at least within every fourteen months, to date from the period when last washed:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did by Order, dated the 20th December, 1882, direct that the Regulations in section 33 should not apply to foundries:

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction, that as regards the foundries specified in the Schedule hereto, the said Order is no longer necessary:

Now I, the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do by this Order, rescind the said Order

of the 20th December, 1882, so far as regards the foundries specified in the Schedule hereto.

This Order will come into effect on the 1st July, 1894. *H. H. Asquith.*

Foundries in which brass mixing or brass casting is carried on.

The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Orders hereby revoked, or either of them, before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Orders hereby revoked, or either of them, before the date of this revocation.
