the Bishop of London for the time being and in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and the Metropolitical Church of Christ Canterbury the first turn of appointment and presentation to be vested in the Bishop of London.

" Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill and of the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town which are described in the Schedule hereunder written (all of which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed) shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Hallows North Saint Pancras' and that the said district so soon as a minister shall have been licensed thereto shall be endowed as contemplated by the firstly herein-mentioned Order of Your Majesty in Council.

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and (so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then) of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) of the incumbent of the said new parish shall (as is provided by the hereinbefore recited Order in Council) be assigned to and be vested alternately in the said Bishop of London for the time being and in the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Christ Canterbury, the first turn of appointment and presentation to be vested in the said Bishop of London.

" And we further recommend and propose that

nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Hallows North Saint Pancras comprising:-

"I. All that portion of the parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill within the original limits of the parish of Saint Pancras in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, which is bounded upon the west partly by the new parish of Saint Saviour South Hampstead and partly by the new parish of Saint Stephen Hampstead both in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the north by the parish of Kentish Town within the original limits of the said parish of Saint Pancras upon the east by the hereinafter described portion of the parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town also within the original limits of the said parish of Saint Paneras and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-east and upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town from the parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill aforesaid at the point where Allcroft-road joins the roadway called or known as Lismore-circus the said point being over the tunnel which carries the main line of the Midland Railway under the

said circus and extending thence generally westward along the middle of the last-named roadway for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction at the Haverstock Hill Railway Station on the said line of railway with Rochford-street (formerly called or known as Circus-road) and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Southampton-road and extending thence westward and in a straight line across the last-named road to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence which forms the northeastern boundary of the garden and premises attached to the building called or known as Saint Dominick's Priory and situate upon the south-western side of the last-named road and extending thence north-westward along the said wall or fence for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill from the new parish of Saint Saviour, South Hampstead aforesaid.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town which is bounded upon the west by the hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill upon the north and north-east by the parish of Kentish Town aforesaid and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Kentish Town from the parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town aforesaid at the centre of the tunnel which carries the Hampstead Junction Railway over the main line of the Midland Railway aforesaid and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-mentioned line of railway for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the roadway called or known as Lismore-circus as aforesaid above the middle of the tunnel which carries the said last-mentioned line of railway under the said circus and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named roadway for a distance of seventy links or thereabouts to the point where the same roadway is joined by Allcroft-road as aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town from the parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and the patrons and incumbents of the said parish of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the patron and the incumbent of the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town have offered certain objections to the said scheme.

And whereas (notwithstanding such objections) the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.
