Madrid, March 25.

HE Marquis de Leganez is on his departure for Milan to take possession of that Government. The new Levies are continued for the Service of Catalonia; And the Vice-Admiul Papachino is ordered with 4 Spanish Men of War but lye in the Bay of Cadiz, to fail to Malaga, and transport from thence to Bircelona the Regiments of Andslusia and Grenada; after which he is to coize in the Mediterrane.tn with these and the other Men of War that are now fitting at Cadiz. The king has given the Patriarchship of the Indies to Don Pedro de Porto Carrero, and the place of Commissary-General of the Cruzado to Don Gonzaio Fer-

Warsaw, March 30. On Sunday last the Prin-Ris Palatine of Neubourg made her Publick Entry into this City. She was received by the Prince on the Frontiers of Silefia, and was met several miles from hence by the King and Queen of Poland, attended by a great number of Senators, and other Persons of the chiefest Quality; Her Reception here was with great Solemnity and Magnificence; And Feaftings and publick Divertisements have been continued for several days together.

The Publick Rejoycings on this occasion being orer, the Military Conferences are refumed, the King resolving to be early in the Field at the Head of a very confiderable Army, and to act with it according to the measures concerted between him and the Emperor.

Vienna, April 8. Several Soldiers, who lately made their escape from Belgrade where they were Priloners, give an account, that the Turks work very hard on the Fortifications of that place; That there is in it a Garison of about 4000 men; that they talk of great Preparations for the Campagne; and that the Grand Visier will himself command the Ottoman Army in Hungary this Summer; That they are providing a great number of Boats, and pritularly 80 large Barks, which are to be commaded by the late Buffa of Sigrab; and that they are maded by the late Buffa of Sigrab; re making a standing Bridge over the Danube near Peter. Waradin. We hear too, that Teckeley, who continues about the Frontiers of Valachia, is endeafouring to get together a Body of Turks and Hunguians, with a delign, as tis thought, to act with them towards Transituania. But whilft we receive the endvices of the Enemics Preparations, ours are

fo advanced, that there is no reason to doubt, but that we shall be in the Field before them with a numerous and powerful Army. By the return of the Express that was lately fent to Prince Louis of Baden, to haffen his return hither from Bihemia; in order to his taking upon him the command of the Imperial Army in Hungary, we are affored, that he will be here before the end of this week; In the mean time all Officers are commanded to repair immediately to their respective Regiments; The newraifed Troops are on their march towards Hingan; and the Count de Bathiani, who went lately thither to draw together a Body of Hungarians, is ordered to march with them towards Effect, where he will be joyned by the Imperial Troops quarte ed thereabouts, to form a flying Camp for the greater security of that place; From whence we are told, that the new Fortifications are almost finished, and that they have made a very deep Ditch round the Town, and filled it with the Water of the Drave. General Dunemale, who was lately fent to the Court of Saxon, is expected back here in few days, having finished his Negotiation there to the Emperor's latisfaction.

Basle, April 8. This City has for some time been under great disturbances, which were begun by a Dispute between the Great and Little Council about Matters of Jurisdiction, and went so far as to divide the Inhabitants into two Parties, and to occasion great Heats among them, not without a reasonable suspicion, that they were secretly fomented by the Partifans of France, with a delign to make advantage of our Diforders; and particularly on the 3d instant a great Commotion had like to have happened here, but it was in the beginning of it appeafed; In the mean time the General Dyct of the Suis Cantons, now affirmbled at Buien, have taken Cognizance of these Differences amongst us, and are funding a Deputation hither to endeavour to compose them.

The meeting of this Dyet was chiefly occasioned by the Complaints of the Imperial Minister, concerning their suffering their Troops in the French Service to be employed contrary to their ancient Treaties and Alliances with the House of Austra.; and all the Cantons have thereupon refolved to hinder these Contraventions for the future, except Solo-churne, Frib org, and Glaris. In the fift of these Cantons, the French Party prevailed in their Great Council, confifting of 100 Persons, only by 3 Voices, and the other two have not yet taken any Refolution in this matter.

As for the Neutrality of the Forest Towns, they Caried on with that difigence and vigour, and are were expecting at Balen the return of the Courier

which the French Ambassador had sent to France, to know the Resolution of that Court about it.

The Advices from Dresden Francfort, April 17. do affure us, that the Electro of Saxony's Forces will be on the Rhine by the middle of the next month, and that his Electoral Highness intends to command them in Person if his health will permit. The Elector of Bavaria had, in his return from the Hague, a Conference with the Elector of Trier at Coblentz, and with the Great Master of the Tentonick Order, and General Thungen at Losheym; He arrived on the 9th instant at Hydelberg, and 'twas said, that his Electoral Highness would go from thence directly to Municken, to give orders for 4000 men of his Troops (which were before defigned for Hungary) to march immediately to the affiliance of the Duke of Savoy.

Hamburgh, April 17. The Letters from Dresden say, that the Forces of Saxony, to the number of 12 or 14000 men, are preparing for their march, to joyn the Confederate Army on the Upper Rhine. And from Berlin they write, that feveral Brandenburg Troops are ordered to march towards Cleves, to reinforce those that have had their Quarters this Winter near the Meuse. The Sieur de Haxbuysen, Envoy Extraordinary from Denmark, passed through this place on the 13th instant in his way to Berlin.

Cologne, April 17. The Forces of Hesse are now encamped on the River Abr, where it's believed they will be joyned by those of Munster and Neubourg. Commissions will be suddenly given out for the Raifing the fix new Regiments, which the States of this Diocess have resolved to maintain at their own Charge during the War. We hear from the Upper Rhine, that the Imperial and Confederate Troops have orders to be in a readiness to march into the Field by the middle of the next month.

Edinburgh, April 11. The last Letters from Inverness give an account, that things are very quiet there, and that they did not hear of any motion of the Highlanders. The Ships bound for Flanders, with Recruits for the Scotch Regiments, lie ready to Sail with the first fair Wind.

Falmouth, April 13. This Day arrived here the Spanish Alliance Pacquet-Boat in in Days from the Groyn; There came out with her a Spanish Ship richlyladen, but they had not been 24 Hours at Sea when fhe fprung a Leak, and was obliged to put in again for the Shore. The Emanuel of Copenhagen is come into this Port bound for St. Sebastions.

Plimouth, April 14. Here are come in no Veilels fince my last, except the Charity of Copenhagen, with another Foreign Vessel bound for Lisbon.
