Madrid, March 25.

THE Marquis de Leganez is on his departure for Milan to take possession of that Government. The new Levies are continued for the Service of Catalonia; And the Vice-Admiral Papachino is ordered with 4 Spanish Men of War that lye in the Bay of Cadix, to sail to Malaga, and transport from thence to Barcelona the Regiments of Andalusia and Grenada; after which he is to cruize in the Mediterranean with these and the other Men of War that are now fitting at Cadix. The King has given the Patriarchship of the Indies to Don Pedro de Porto Carrero, and the place of Commissary-General of the Cruzado to Don Gonzalo Fernandez de Cordoua.

Warsaw, March 30. On Sunday last the Princess Palatine of Neubourg made her Publick Entry into this City. She was received by the Prince on the Frontiers of Silesia, and was met several miles from hence by the King and Queen of Poland, attended by a great number of Senators, and other Persons of the chiefest Quality; Her Reception here was with great Solemnity and Magnificence; And Feastings and publick Divertisements have been continued for several days together.

The Publick Rejoycings on this occasion being over, the Military Conferences are resumed, the King resolving to be early in the Field at the Head of a very considerable Army, and to act with it according to the measures concerted between him and the Emperor.

Vienna, April 8. Several Soldiers, who lately made their escape from Belgrade where they were Prisoners, give an account, that the Turks work very hard on the Fortifications of that place; That there is in it a Garrison of about 4000 men; that they talk of great Preparations for the Campaign; and that the Grand Visier will himself command the Ottoman Army in Hungary this Summer; That they are providing a great number of Boats, and particularly 80 large Barks, which are to be commanded by the late Bassa of Sigeth; and that they are making a standing Bridge over the Danube near Peter-Waradin. We hear too, that Teckelej, who continues about the Frontiers of Valachia, is endeavouring to get together a Body of Turks and Hungarians, with a design, as 'tis thought, to act with them towards Transylvania. But whilst we receive these advices of the Enemies Preparations, ours are carried on with that diligence and vigour, and are

so advanced, that there is no reason to doubt, but that we shall be in the Field before them with a numerous and powerful Army. By the return of the Express that was lately sent to Prince Louis of Baden, to hasten his return hither from Bohemia; in order to his taking upon him the command of the Imperial Army in Hungary, we are assured, that he will be here before the end of this week; In the mean time all Officers are commanded to repair immediately to their respective Regiments; The new-raised Troops are on their march towards Hungary; and the Count de Barbianni, who went lately thither to draw together a Body of Hungarians, is ordered to march with them towards Esseeck, where he will be joyned by the Imperial Troops quartered thereabouts, to form a flying Camp for the greater security of that place; From whence we are told, that the new Fortifications are almost finished, and that they have made a very deep Ditch round the Town, and filled it with the Water of the Drave. General Dunemale, who was lately sent to the Court of Saxony, is expected back here in few days, having finished his Negotiation there to the Emperor's satisfaction.

Basle, April 8. This City has for some time been under great disturbances, which were begun by a Dispute between the Great and Little Council about Matters of Jurisdiction, and went so far as to divide the Inhabitants into two Parties, and to occasion great Heats among them, not without a reasonable suspicion, that they were secretly fomented by the Partisans of France, with a design to make advantage of our Disorders; and particularly on the 2d instant a great Commotion had like to have happened here, but it was in the beginning of it appeased; In the mean time the General Dyet of the Swiss Cantons, now assembled at Basle, have taken Cognizance of these Differences amongst us, and are sending a Deputation hither to endeavour to compose them.

The meeting of this Dyet was chiefly occasioned by the Complaints of the Imperial Minister, concerning their suffering their Troops in the French Service to be employed contrary to their ancient Treaties and Alliances with the House of Austria; and all the Cantons have thereupon resolved to hinder these Contraventions for the future, except Solothurne, Friburg, and Glaris. In the first of these Cantons, the French Party prevailed in their Great Council, consisting of 100 Persons, only by 3 Voices, and the other two have not yet taken any Resolution in this matter.

As for the Neutrality of the Forest Towns, they were expecting at Baden the return of the Courier which
