THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 24th August, 1894, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, enclosing the following Sanitary Ordinance relative to arrivals in Bulgaria by the Orient Express:—

Sofia, le 11/28 Août, 1894.

Le Conseil Sanitaire Supérieur de la Principauté dans sa séance du 10 courant a pris la décision suivante.

Comme l'Orient Express prendra des voyageurs seulement de Constantinople et que, à partir de la

station de Tchataldja jusqu'à celle de Mustafa-Pacha inclusivement il ne prendra ni voyageurs ni marchandises, les voyageurs arrivant par l'Orient Express à destination de l'Occident et de la Bulgarie pourront passer par Hebitchêvo contre une simple visite médicale à Harmanly.

Le Médecin d'arrondissement de Harmanly communiquera aux autorités administratives de ressort les noms des voyageurs qui descendront en Bulgarie, et les autorités, par l'entremise des organes sanitaires soumettront les voyageurs à une observation médicale de cinq jours au lieu de leur destination.
