GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Qualification of Managers in School Districts.

To the Boards of Management of the several School Districts named in the Schedule to this Order ;-

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Separate Parishes comprised in the said School Districts;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain Orders issued by the Poor. Law Board, or by Us, the Local Government Board, a qualification has been fixed in respect of each of the several School Districts named in the Schedule to this Order, without which no person is eligible to serve as an elective Member of the Board of Management of such School District;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to such qualifi-

cation as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us in that behalf, hereby Order that, notwithstanding anything contained in any of the Orders above referred to, the qualification, without which no person shall be eligible to serve as an elective Member of the Board of Management of any School District named in the Schedule to this Order, shall, from and after the date of this Order, consist in being rated within such School District to the relief of the poor upon an annual rateable value of not less than Fire Pounds.

SCHEDULE.

The Order of the Privy Council dated the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five approving of parts of the Port of Bristol as landing-places for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine.

The whole Order so far as it is unrevoked.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Foreign Animals Order of 1893, dated the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, certain cattle on board the steamship Maori King, which has just arrived in the port of London from Australia, may be transhipped in the River Thames from such vessel to the vessel Racoon (in this Order called the landing-vessel) for conveyance to the Foreign Animals Wharf, known as the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford.

2. Those cattle shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs, and an Officer of Customs shall remain in charge of the animals on boardthe landing-vessel until its arrival at the Foreign Animals Wharf.

3. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to that Wharf, and the cattle shall be landed there

in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

4.—(1.) The landing-vessel shall immediately after the landing of such cattle, and before being again used, be cleansed and disinfected as follows :

(i.) All parts of the landing-vessel with which the cattle or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept-: then -

(ii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water: then

(iii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash: except that

(iv.) The application of lime-wash shall not be compulsory as regards such parts of the landing-vessel as are used for the crew.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the landing-vessel shall not be landed unless and until they have been well mixed with quicklime.

5. The cattle so transhipped shall continue to

be deemed foreign animals.

6. If anything is done or omitted to be done in

contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the landing-vessel, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the above-mentioned Act.

7. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in the Foreign Animals Order of 1893.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of and define the following part of the Port of Liverpool as a landing-place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine:

All that space in the township of Poulton-cum-Seacombe, in the county of Chester, comprising the sheds numbered respectively 1, 2, and 3 on the plan of the said landing-place for foreign animals hereinafter-mentioned, and the Quay margin between the said sheds and the between the Wallasey Dock, all which space is situate on the north side of the said Dock, and contains an area of seven thousand six hundred and ninety-five square yards or thereabouts, being bounded by a line commencing at a point on the north coping line of the said Dock ten feet or thereabouts eastward of the intersection of the north and west coping lines of the said Dock, and continuing thence eastwardly along the said north coping line for a distance of seven hundred and ninety-six feet or thereabouts, thence northwardly for a distance of eighty-seven feet or thereabouts, along the outside of a close wooden fence and of the east wall of the said shed numbered 3 on the said plan, thence westwardly for a distance of seven hundred and ninety-six feet or thereabouts along the outside of the north wall of the said sheds numbered respectively 1, 2, and 1 names:—

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting:

WHEREAS a new church has lately been built within the parish of Brechfa, in the county of Carmarthen, and in the diocese of Saint David's, and has been consecrated and dedicated to Saint Teilo.

And whereas the Right Reverend William Basil, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's, and John Williams Gwynne-Hughes, of Tregib, Llandilo, in the said county of Car-marthen, Esquire, and Lewis Morgan-Grenville, of Moreton Lodge, Buckingham, in the county of Buckingham, a Major in Her Majesty's Army, the patrons of the rectory of the said parish of Brechfa, and the Reverend David Morris Jones, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Rector or Incumbent of the same rectory, have, by an instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the twenty-first day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Brechfa that the said new church of Saint Teilo, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (also dedicated to Saint Teilo) of the same parish.

of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all | other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do, by this instru-ment under our common seal, with the consent (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said William Basil, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's, and of the said John Williams Gwynne-Hughes, and of the said Lewis Morgan-Grenville, and of the said David Morris Jones, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint Teilo, situate within the said parish of Brechfa, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be, and the same is hereby, substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Teilo as aforesaid) of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said parish of Brechfa in lieu of the said old parish church of Saint Teilo as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint Teilo so hereby substituted had been originally the parish church of the same parish.

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Teilo as aforesaid) of the said parish of Brechfa, or of or belonging to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint Teilo (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said parish of Brechfa), and to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, and his successors

for ever.
