THEREAS there was concluded between Her Majesty and the President of the Chilean Republic, on the 26th of September, 1893, a Convention for the Settlement, by means of a Tribunal of Arbitration, of the Claims of British Subjects arising out of the Civil War in Chile of

The Articles of the Convention - are as follows :-

ARTICLE I.

A Tribunal of Arbitration shall decide, in the manner and in accordance with the terms precribed in Article V of the present Convention, all claims for which the Government of Chile may be held responsible in view of the acts and operations executed by the land and sea forces of the Republic during the civil war which began on the 7th of January, 1891, and ended on the 28th of August of the same year, and also those claims which were caused by subsequent events, for which the Government may be held responsible under the provisions of said Article V.

The claims must be supported by Her Britannic Majesty's Legation, and must be presented within the term of six months from the date of the establishment of the Tribunal.

ARTICLE II.

The Tribunal shall consist of three members, that is to say: one appointed by his Excellency the President of the Republic of Chile, one by Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and a third by both High Contracting Parties. This third member shall be neither a Chilean citizen nor a subject of Her Britannic Majesty.

artiçle III.

The Tribunal shall admit such methods of proof and inquiry as may, in the judgment and opinion of its members, conduce most effectually to the elucidation of the matters in dispute, and in particular, to the establishment of the status and neutral character of the several claimants.

The Tribunal shall also admit written and verbal statements made by either Government, or by the Agents or Counsel of either Government.

ARTICLE IV.

Either Government may appoint an Agent with power to watch over the interests committed to his charge; to defend those interests, present petitions, documents, and interrogatories; to state and argue points at issue; to argue in favour of the interests committed to his charge and against | its duties in regard to all claims submitted to its

the opponents of those interests; to tender evidence and lay before the Tribunal, personally or by Counsel, verbally or in writing (under such rules of procedure and office regulations as the Tribunal shall itself adopt at the commencement of its labours), all such legal doctrines, principles, and precedents as shall seem to him proper.

ARTICLE V.

The Tribunal shall decide the claims according to the evidence tendered, and in accordance with the principles of international law and the practice and jurisprudence established by such analogous modern Tribunals as enjoy the greatest authority and the best reputation, and shall give its decisions, whether provisional or final, by

majority of votes.

The Tribunal shall express shortly, in every final judgment, the facts and origin of each claim, the arguments alleged for and against each, and the principles of international law on which the Tribunal's decision is made to rest.

The decisions and judgments of the Tribunal shall be in writing, and shall be signed by all the members and be attested by the Secretary; the originals shall, together with the document; belonging to each, be deposited in the Chilean Ministry for Foreign Affairs, and copies shall be given to the parties at their request.

The Tribunal shall keep a register, in which shall be noted its proceedings, the petitions of claimants, and the judgments and decisions of the Tribunal.

The Tribunal shall sit at Santiago.

ARTICLE VI.

The Tribunal may appoint such secretaries, reporters, and other officials as it may deem necessary for the proper discharge of its duties.

The Tribunal shall nominate the persons who are to occupy the above-mentioned offices, and shall name the salary or remuneration to be assigned to each.

The said officials shall be appointed by his Excellency the President of the Republic of Chile.

Such judgments of the Tribunal as are to be executed in Chile shall have the support of the Executive in the same manner as the judgments of the ordinary legal Tribunals of that country. Such judgments as are to be executed abroad shall be executed in accordance with the rules and usages of private international law.

ARTICLE VII.

The Tribunal shall, for the final discharge of

consideration and decision, be allowed a term of one year from the date on which it shall declare itself validly constituted. When this term shall have expired the Tribunal shall have power to prolong its existence for a further period, which may not exceed six months, in case the illness or temporary incapacity of any of its members, or any other event of acknowledged gravity, may have prevented it from fulfilling the duties intrusted to it within the term fixed under the first paragraph of this Article.

ARTICLE VIII.

Each of the Contracting Governments shall bear the expenses of its own proceedings and the remuneration of its own Agents and Counsel.

The payment of salaries to the members of the Tribunal shall commence only from the date of

the commencement of their duties.

Expenses involved by the creation of the Tribunal, the remuneration of its members, the salaries of the secretaries, reporters, and other officials, and all other expenses and costs of the services rendered to both parties, shall be defrayed in moieties by the two Governments; but if any sums of money are awarded to the claimants there shall be deducted therefrom the above-mentioned common expenses and costs, in so far as they shall not exceed 6 per cent. of the total amounts to be paid by the Chilean Treasury on account of such claims respectively as may be admitted.

claims respectively as may be admitted.

Sums awarded by the Tribunal to claimants shall be paid by the Government of Chile to the Government of Her Britannic Majesty through Her Majesty's Legation at Santiago, or through any person designated for the purpose by Her Majesty, within the term of one year from the date on which judgment on any claim shall have been given, but no interest shall during such time

accrue to the successful claimant.

The Government of Chile will deduct from any sums paid by them in satisfaction of claims submitted to the Tribunal, whether paid by order of the Tribunal or by private arrangement, the amounts stipulated in the third paragraph of this Article, such amounts to be retained and applied towards payment of the common expenses of arbitration.

ARTICLE IX.

The High Contracting Parties bind themselves to consider the decisions of the Tribunal established by the present Convention as affording a satisfactory, complete, and irrevocable settlement of the difficulties which it is proposed to abrogate, and to agree that all claims of subjects of Her Britannic Majesty presented, or omitted to be presented, under the conditions laid down in the preceding Articles, shall equally be held to be finally decided, and to have been the subject of a judgment, in such a manner that for no cause or pretext can such claims ever again be examined or discussed.

ARTICLE X.

If the High Contracting Parties do not agree respecting the nomination of an Umpire, His Majesty the King of the Belgians shall be requested to name one, and in that case the period within which the Tribunal shall commence its labours shall be six months from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of this Convention.

ARTICLE XI.

The present Convention shall be ratified by the High Contracting Parties, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Santiago.

And whereas the Ratifications of the said Conventions were exchanged at Santiago on the 24th of April, 1894:

Notice is hereby given that the aforesaid Tribunal of Arbitration will sit at Santiago on or about the 24th of October next, and that the claims of British Subjects arising out of the said Civil War must be lodged at the British Legation at Santiago within six months of the date of the First Meeting of the Tribunal of Arbitration.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 28th July, 1894, from Her Majesty's Representative at Monte Video, enclosing a translation of a Sanitary Convention concluded between the Argentine and Uruguayan Sanitary Departments. The following is an extract therefrom :-

Section IV .- Sanitary Measures.

14. With reference to this agreement both departments understand that the prophylactic measures prescribed in their respective regulations are the same, and to avoid any doubt on the matter they have resolved to specify them in this protocol.

15. Vessels carrying a sanitary inspector and that have all the requirements for disinfection as laid down in both countries will be subject to the

following treatment:-

(a.) If proceeding from a foul or suspected port, and if the duration of the voyage has been less than the maximum time of incubation of the malady, and if report of the sanitary inspector is satisfactory, and nothing fresh has occurred on board and all her papers are in order, she will be placed in complementary quarantine (cuarentena complementaria), the inspector remaining on board in order that he may continue to take the proper precautions and watch over the vessel.

(b.) The ship that is in the same condition as stated above, and when the voyage has exceeded the maximum period of incubation of the disease, shall have free pratique as soon as she has been

visited by the health authorities.

As much in this as in the former and following cases it is understood that the vessel has on board no suspicious articles that could infect the passengers or crew; if such exist and have not been disinfected and require disinfecting, the ship will not be freed from quarantine till after the disinfection has taken place; otherwise the vessel and crew will be placed in strict quarantine.

(c.) If in a ship under those conditions one or more cases have occurred, the same principles laid down in the foregoing clauses shall be applied, provided that the sanitary inspector certifies the exact date of the termination of the last case, also that all disinfecting measures required by the regulations of the two countries have been adopted also with respect to the actual state of health of those on board.

That the sanitary authorities satisfy themselves

to the truth of the report given.

As regards the duration of the voyage, it will be considered as having commenced from the date of the last efficient disinfection, and with regard to the question of whether complementary quarantine shall be imposed or free pratiqué granted, the point shall be decided by the number of days which have elapsed since the termination of the last case of sickness.

(d.) If the vessel on its arrival should have any one on board attacked by any infectious disease, she will be placed in strict quarantine according to the terms that are established in the sanitary regulations of the two countries.

16. Vessels that have no sanitary inspector on board, and which may be considered suspected or infected, shall always be subjected to rigorous

quarantine.

The length of duration of tigorous quarantine shall be decided by the length of the maximum time of incubation of the infectious disease, that is ten days for yellow fever, and eight days for 'hole ra.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order bearing date the 28th day of August, 1890 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), in exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by Section 2 of the Public Health Act, 1889, made certain rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of that disease;

And whereas by a further Order dated the 6th day of September, 1892, We made additional Regulations for the prevention of the spread of Cholera, and by Article V thereof directed that such Order should be read as one with the Regulations:

And whereas by an Order dated the 28th day of November, 1887, which came into operation on the 2nd day of January, 1888, We constituted permanently a Joint Board, to be termed "The Dover (Deal Division) Port Sanitary Authority," to be the Port Sanitary Authority for the part of

the Port of Dover therein described;
And whereas it is provided by Article 6 of the Regulations that every Port Sanitary Authority and every other Sanitary Authority within whose District persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming foreign shall, as speedily as practicable, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place where the Master of any ship certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera shall, as required by Article 10 of the Regulations, moor or anchor her until the requirements of the Regulations have been duly fulfilled; and that the place to be fixed as aforesaid shall be some place within the jurisdiction or district of the

Sanitary Authority, unless We, the Local Government Board, otherwise consent;

And whereas it is also provided by the said Article 6 that any place fixed as aforesaid, with Our consent, outside the jurisdiction or district of a Sanitary Authority, shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be within such jurisdiction or district:

And whereas the said Port Sanitary Authority propose to fix the place hereinafter referred to, and shown by a triangle drawn in red on the Map or Chart in the Schedule annexed to this Order, as the place where any ship may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations, and such place being situate without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for Our consent in the matter:

Now therefore We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the abovementioned Sections, and of every other power enabling Us in this behalf, do hereby Declare as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—We consent to the said Dover (Deal Division) Port Sanitary Authority fixing, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port of Dover, the waters included within the triangle drawn in red on the Map or Chart in the Schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship bound to any place within the District of such Port Sanitary Authority, and certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera, shall be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—The jurisdiction of the said Port Sanitary Authority shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to extend, and, subject to the provisions of this Order, the Regulations shall apply to any ship so certified which in pursuance of the Regulations or of any directions given thereunder shall be moored at, or shall be on its way to, the place so fixed as a Mooring Station as hereinbefore mentioned.
