THE Board of Trade have received, through  
the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy  
of a Despatch, dated 28th July, 1894, from Her  
Majesty's Representative at Monte Video, enclos-  
ing a translation of a Sanitary Convention con-  
cluded between the Argentine and Uruguayan  
Sanitary Departments. The following is an ex-  
tract therefrom:—

## Section IV.—Sanitary Measures.

14. With reference to this agreement both  
departments understand that the prophylactic  
measures prescribed in their respective regula-  
tions are the same, and to avoid any doubt on the  
matter they have resolved to specify them in this  
protocol.

15. Vessels carrying a sanitary inspector and  
that have all the requirements for disinfection as  
laid down in both countries will be subject to the  
following treatment:—

(a.) If proceeding from a foul or suspected  
port, and if the duration of the voyage has been  
less than the maximum time of incubation of the  
malady, and if report of the sanitary inspector is  
satisfactory, and nothing fresh has occurred on  
board and all her papers are in order, she will be  
placed in complementary quarantine (cuarentena  
complementaria), the inspector remaining on board  
in order that he may continue to take the proper  
precautions and watch over the vessel.

(b.) The ship that is in the same condition as  
stated above, and when the voyage has exceeded  
the maximum period of incubation of the disease,  
shall have free pratique as soon as she has been  
visited by the health authorities.

As much in this as in the former and following  
cases it is understood that the vessel has on  
board no suspicious articles that could infect the  
passengers or crew; if such exist and have not  
been disinfected and require disinfecting, the ship  
will not be freed from quarantine till after the  
disinfection has taken place; otherwise the vessel  
and crew will be placed in strict quarantine.

(c.) If in a ship under those conditions one or  
more cases have occurred, the same principles laid  
down in the foregoing clauses shall be applied,  
provided that the sanitary inspector certifies the  
exact date of the termination of the last case, also  
that all disinfecting measures required by the  
regulations of the two countries have been adopted  
also with respect to the actual state of health of  
those on board.

That the sanitary authorities satisfy themselves  
to the truth of the report given.

As regards the duration of the voyage, it will  
be considered as having commenced from the  
date of the last efficient disinfection, and with  
regard to the question of whether complementary  
quarantine shall be imposed or free pratique  
granted, the point shall be decided by the number  
of days which have elapsed since the termination  
of the last case of sickness.

(d.) If the vessel on its arrival should have  
any one on board attacked by any infectious  
disease, she will be placed in strict quarantine  
according to the terms that are established in the  
sanitary regulations of the two countries.

16. Vessels that have no sanitary inspector on  
board, and which may be considered suspected or  
infected, shall always be subjected to rigorous  
quarantine.

The length of duration of rigorous quarantine  
shall be decided by the length of the maximum  
time of incubation of the infectious disease, that
