SUIVANT une décision du Conseil Sanitaire, à partir du 24 Août, a.c., sont entrées en vigueur les mesures quaranténaires suivantes.

Les voyageurs venant directement de Russie par le Danube ne peuvent entrer en Bulgarie, jusqu'à nouvelle disposition, que par le port de Silistra, où ils seront soumis à une observation médicale sévère et leurs bagages et effets désinfectés à l'étuve.

Les voyageurs peuvent ensuite se diriger dans l'intérieur de la Principauté, et seront soumis, à leur domicile, à une observation médicale de cinq jours.

SUIVANT une décision du Conseil Sanitaire, à partir du 2-14 Septembre a.c. sont entrées en vigueur les mesures quaranténaires suivantes.

(1.) Pour que la libre pratique dans tous les ports bulgares puisse être accordée aux bateaux venant directement de Russie, il faut qu'après leur arrivée à Silistra, non seulement ces bateaux mêmes soient désinfectés, mais aussi leur équipage, et que cette désinfection ait lieu pour le compte de ces bateaux. En cas contraire, l'équipage des bateaux non désinfectés ne peut pas entrer en relations directes avec la population riveraine, et les voyageurs qui ont subi la désinfection à Silistra ne peuvent pas voyager à bord des mêmes bateaux pour se rendre aux autres ports bulgares.

(2.) Les voyageurs qui arrivent de Roumaine à bord de bateaux venant de Russie sont soumis à une observation médicale et leurs effets désinfectés à l'étuve à Silistra.

(3.) Sont appliquées aux provenances de Russie et de Galicie les mesures énoncées dans la circulaire du Département des Affaires Etrangères en date du 20 Novembre, 1893, et concernant les articles dont l'importation est interdite en Bulgarie s'ils proviennent des localités contaminées par le choléra.
