THE Queen has been pleased to give directions for the appointment of David Gentle, Esq., M.D., to be an Unofficial Member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of British Honduras.

Whitehall, October 1, 1894.

THE Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto John McDonald, Esq., Her Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Order of the Rising Sun of the Sixth Class, which His Majesty the Emperor of Japan has been pleased to confer upon him in recognition of his services whilst actually and entirely employed beyond Her Majesty's Dominions in the service of the Imperial Japanese Government Railways.

BY virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George III, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess:"

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, that Arnold Allan Cecil Keppel (commonly called Viscount Bury), late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the Borough of Birkenhead, is become a Peer of the United Kingdom, and that a writ of Summons hath been issued to him under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom to summon him to Parliament, and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said Borough of Birkenhead, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
