By the QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

THEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Saturday, the tenth day of November next; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Thursday, the twentieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this fifteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-eighth year

of Our reign.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

T is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Friday, the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council HEREAS Charles Neve Cresswell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed as Commissioner for the purposes of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882–1893 has transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his scheme in the following terms:-

"MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACTS, 1882-1893.

" County Borough of Brighton. "WHEREAS a Petition from the Council of the county borough of Brighton praying for the much of the area of the county borough of

alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the county borough has been presented

to Her Majesty.

"And whereas Her Majesty has been pleased by Order in Council to refer the said petition to the Lords of the Council for consideration, and did upon their report by Order dated the seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and, ninety-four in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in Her Majesty by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act 1893, and in pursuance of every other power enabling Her in that behalf, fix the number of Wards into which the said county borough of Brighton shall be divided, and thereupon ordered and directed that the number of the said Wards shall be fourteen.

"And whereas on the thirteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State did in pursuance of the thirtieth section of the Municipal Corporations Act as amended as aforesaid, warrant and appoint Charles Neve Cresswell Esquire Barrister-at-Law to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of the Wards of the county borough of Brighton and for apportioning the Councillors among them the number of such Wards having been fixed as aforesaid.

"Now I the said Charles Neve Cresswell do hereby in pursuance of the said warrant of appointment determine the boundaries of the fourteen Wards into which the said county borough shall be divided which Wards are hereinafter numbered and named as follows that is to

say :"Ward No. 1 otherwise Kemp Town Ward. "Ward No. 2 otherwise Queen's Park Ward.

"Ward No. 3 otherwise Pier Ward. "Ward No. 4 otherwise Pavilion Ward.

"Ward No. 5 otherwise Regency Ward.

"Ward No. 6 otherwise West Ward.

"Ward No. 7 otherwise Montpelier Ward.

"Ward No. 8 otherwise Saint Nicholas Ward.

"Ward No. 9 otherwise Saint John's Ward.

"Ward No. 10 otherwise Hanover Ward.

"Ward No. 11 otherwise Lewes-road Ward.

"Ward No. 12 otherwise Saint Peter's Ward.

"Ward No. 13 otherwise Preston Park Ward. "Ward No. 14 otherwise Preston Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 1, otherwise Kemp Town Ward shall comprise so
