THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked, and the Order dated the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, prohibiting the sale or exposure for sale of any cattle sheep or swine in or at the Borough Cattle Market in the borough of Guildford, shall be read and have effect as if the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and

ninety-five were substituted for the third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three in Article 3 of the last-mentioned Order, as the date from and immediately after which that Order shall take effect.
