CHINA—YANG TSE KIANG.

Temporary Withdrawal of Buoys in Vicinity of Lang Shan Crossing.

INFORMATION has been received from Commander J. E. Bearcroft, H.M.S. "Linnet," dated 23rd August, 1894, that Mr. Mobsby, Yang Tse Government pilot, reports that all the buoys in Confucius and Harvey Point Channels, and in Lang Shan Crossing, up to North Tree, have been temporarily withdrawn.

Also, that the remarkable single high-forked tree, westward of Confucius Channel, has been cut down.

Approximate position, Forked Tree, latitude 31° 42' 30" N., longitude 121° 6' 30" E.
