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#### PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty chapter sixtythree duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and

figures following, that is to say:—
"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late M jesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thur ee a and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the archdeaconries and rural deaneries or some of them which are within the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas there are at present three archdeaconries within the said diocese of Lichfield to wit, the archdeaconry of Salop, the archdeaconry of Stafford and the archdeaconry of Stoke-upon-Trent.

And whereas a statutory schedule (prepared under the provisions of the hereinbefore lastlymentioned Act) of the rural deaneries within the said two archdeaconries of Salop and Stafford respectively, and also of the rural deaneries within the archdeaconry of Derby, then in the said diocese of Lichfield, but at present comprised within the diocese of Southwell, was delighted in the diocesan registry at Lichfield.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council, dated the eleventh day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-fourth day of the same month, the said archdeaconry of Stokeupon-Trent was formed out of the said Archdeaconry of Stafford.

"And whereas under the provisions of another

T the Court at Windsor, the 20th day of Order of Your Majesty in Council, dated the second day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and published in the London Gazette on the fifth day of the same month, the diocese of Southwell was created and comprised (inter alia) a portion of the said diocese of Lichfield.

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Honourable and Right Reverend Augustus Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said archdeaconries and rural deaneries or some of them within the said diocese are desirable and should. be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that. the same may properly be carried into effect.

"And whereas the said arrangements involve the transfer in certain cases of certain parishes or cures or churches from one archdeaconry to another archdeaconry, that is to say, they involve the transfer of one parish or cure (that is to say, the parish of Sheriff Hales with Woodcote) from the said archdeaconry of Stafford to the said archdecoury of Salop, and the transfer of three parishes or cures (that is to say the parish of Ranton, the parish of Fradswell, and the parish of Stowe-by-Chartley) from the said archdeaconry of Stafford to the said archdeaconry of Stokeupon-Trent, and also the transfer of certain parishes or cures or churches from certain rural deaneries to certain other rural deaneries.

"And whereas the same arrangements also involve among other alterations of the areas of certain of the rural deaneries within the said archdeaconries, the extinction or absorption of one rural deanery as such, to wit, the rural deanery of Brewood, in the said archdeaconry of Stafford, and they involve the formation of two new rural deaneries in the same archdeaconry of Stafford, and one new rural deanery in the said archdeaconry of Stoke-upon-Trent.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Augustus, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he hath set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said archdeaconry of Salop, the said archdeaconry of Stafford, and the said archdeaconry of Stokeupon-Trent respectively, shall comprise and con-

sist of those rural deaneries, the names of which are set down in order under the name of each of the said three archdeaconries respectively in the Schedule to this scheme annexed, and that the name which in the same Schedule is given to any rural deanery shall be the name thereof; and that every parish, or cure or church, the name of which is set down in numbered order, in the first column of the said Schedule under the name of any one of the said archdeaconries respectively, and under the name of any rural deanery in any one of the said three archdeaconries respectively. shall belong to, and be, and form a part of the archdeaconry and of the rural deanery under the respective names of which it may appear as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the archdeacon of the same archdeaconry, and of the rural dean of the same rural deanery, and shall not belong, or be, or form a part of any other archdeaconry or rural deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other archdeacon or rural dean; the intent of these our recommendations and proposals being, that the said Schedule to this scheme annexed, shall as to the first column thereof be (in so far as the same legally can or may be) as from the day aforesaid substituted for the hereinbefore mentioned statutory Schedule of rural deaneries within the said diocese of Lichfield as aforesaid; so that upon and from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette as aforesaid, the said three archdeaconries of Salop, Stafford, and Stoke-upon-Trent respectively, shall, as aforesaid, comprise and consist of the rural deaneries which are in that behalf set out and specified under the name of each such archdeaconry respectively in the said Schedule to this scheme annexed, and so that every rural ment.

deanery in each such archdeacoury shall comprise. and consist of the parishes, or cures or churches which are in that behalf set out and specified under the name of each such rural deanery in the said first column of the same Schedule, the second column of the same Schedule containing a statement as to the name the archdeaconry within which any parish or cure or church specified in the first column of the said schedule has heretofore been situate; and the third column of the same schedule containing in the case of each of the said three archdeaconries a statement as to the name of the rural deanery within which any such parish or cure or church has heretofore been situate. Which recommendations and proposals in this scheme and in the said Schedule thereto set forth as aforesaid, will have the effect (as by the same Schedule appears), firstly of extinguishing one rural deanery, namely, the rural deanery of Brewood, in the said archdeaconry of Stafford, and of absorbing it into the rural deaneries of Penkridge and of Wolverhampton, in the said archdeacoury of Stafford, and into the rural deanery of Edgmond, within the said archdeaconry of Salop, and secondly, of creating two new rural deaneries within the said archdeaconry of Stafford, namely, 'The rural deamery of Wednesbury' and 'the 'rural deanery of West Bromwich,' and one new rural deanery within the said archdeaconry of Stoke-upon-Trent, namely, 'the rural deanery of Hanley.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

OTICE is hereby given, that the Conservators of the River Thames propose to make the following Bye-laws :-

BYE-LAWS for the regulation of vessels navigating the River Thames through the Tower Bridge.

The Conservators of the River Thames in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the "Thames Conservancy Act, 1894," and of every other authority them hereunto in anywise enabling, do order and direct as follows, that is to say :-

1. The master of every vessel intending to pass up the river through the Tower Bridge shall; notwithstanding any previous Bye-law or regulation, and in addition to the ordinary lights to be carried by such vessel when under way, exhibit before arriving at Cherry Garden Pier, and shall continue to extibit until such vessel shall have passed through the said bridge, the following signals :-

(a.) By day, viz., between sunrise and sunset one black ball not less than two feet in diameter, placed in such a position on such vessel where it can best be seen at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet.

(b.) By night, viz., between sunset and sunrise, two red lights, in globular lanterns of not less than

eight inches each in diameter, placed vertically six feet apart, at a height of not less than 20 feet above the hull, and in such a position where they can best be seen, and so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile on a dark night with a clear atmosphere.

2. The Master of every vessel intending to pass down the river through the said bridge shall. notwithstanding any previous Bye-law or Regulation and in addition to the ordinary lights to be carried by such vessel, exhibit the signals prescribed by the preceding Bye-law until the vessel has

passed through the said bridge.

3. The Master of every vessel shall in foggy weather before approaching the said bridge, either from the upper or lower side thereof, ascertain whether the said bridge will be opened or not.

4. These Bye-laws shall be in addition to and not in substitution for any Bye-laws now in force or which shall hereafter be made by the Conservators under their general powers and which shall apply to the navigation of the river below London Bridge, and nothing in these Bye-laws shall diminish or affect the powers of the Conservators with regard to the regulation of vessels on the

river below London Bridge.
5. The word "master" in these Bye-laws shall have the same meaning and interpretation as in section 3 of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894.

6. The master of any vessel or any person committing any breach of or in any way infringing any of these Bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty of and shall forfeit a sum not exceeding ten pounds, which said penalty may be recovered and enforced summarily, and shall be applied according to the provisions of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894.

7. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The

Tower Bridge Navigation Bye-laws.'
