GERMANY.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, the Warrants made respectively by the Treasury and mentioned in the First Schedule to this Warrant shall be repealed to the extent in the said Schedule mentioned.

Definitions.

2. In this Warrant—

(1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted in the United Kingdom as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same, or is received in the United Kingdom from abroad by Parcel Post.

- (2.) The expression "outgoing" applied to a Parcel means posted in the United Kingdom for transmission abroad.
- (3.) The expression "incoming" applied to a Parcel means received in the United Kingdom through the Post from abroad.
- (4.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.
- (5.) The expression "British Possession" means any part of Her Majesty's Dominions exclusive of the United Kingdom.
- (6.) The expression "Germany" means the Empire of Germany.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

3. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post—

- (a.) Between the United Kingdom and Germany, and
- (b.) Via Germany between the United Kingdom and any place for the conveyance of Parcels, to and from which arrangements between the British and German Post Offices may for the time being exist.

Rates of Postage on Outgoing Parcels.

4. On all outgoing Parcels addressed to any place mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage specified or mentioned in such Schedule.

Maximum Weight and Dimensions.

5. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, no Parcel the weight of which exceeds eleven pounds, or the dimensions of which exceed two feet in length, breadth, or depth, shall be forwarded or delivered by Post. Provided always, that in the case of an outgoing Parcel addressed to any place other than Germany, if the maximum weight and dimensions for the time being authorized between Germany and such country are less than the maximum weight and dimensions aforesaid, then such Parcel shall not exceed seven pounds in weight or two feet in length, or four feet in length and girth combined.

Mode of Posting.

6. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant the following provisions shall apply to the posting of outgoing Parcels, that is to say:—

- (1.) Every Parcel shall be posted by being handed to an officer on duty at the counter in a Post Office.
- (2.) The Parcel must bear the name and full address of the addressee, and must be packed in such manner and form and in accordance with such directions as the Postmaster-General may from time to time prescribe in that behalf. The Parcel must also be accompanied by, or have affixed to it, a declaration of such kind and stating the nature and value of the contents of the Parcel in such manner and form, and with such other particulars as the Commissioners of Customs and the Postmaster-General may prescribe.
- (3.) The Parcel shall be measured and weighed by such officer, and the postage thereof shall be prepaid and shall be verified by such officer.

Collection of Parcels.

7. The Postmaster-General may, if he thinks fit, from time to time authorize such officers as he may direct to receive Parcels for the Post, otherwise than at a Post Office, under such regulations and conditions as he may from time to time prescribe.

Irregular Posting of Parcels.

8. Any outgoing Packet transmissible by Parcel Post which, from any words or marks thereon, or other external evidence, appears to have been intended for transmission as a Parcel, but which has not been tendered for transmission as a Parcel, but has been posted in a Post Office Letter-box, or otherwise than according to the manner hereinbefore prescribed for the posting of Parcels, may, in the discretion of the Postmaster-General, either be detained and returned or given up to the sender, or if the said Packet is fully prepaid with the letter or open packet rate of postage, and otherwise conforms to the regulations as to the letter or open packet post, the same may be forwarded as a letter or open packet (as the case may be).

Return and Disposal of Undelivered Parcels.

9. With regard to—

- (a.) Incoming Parcels which are addressed to a Post Office to be called for, or to a place beyond the limits of the free postal delivery of any town or district, or to a ship at any port, and which are not called for or delivered within such reasonable times as the Postmaster-General may from time to time prescribe; and
- (b.) Incoming Parcels which cannot be delivered for want of a true direction, or by reason that the addressee is dead, or cannot be found, or has refused the same, or has refused or neglected to pay any charges thereon, or for any other sufficient reason; the following provisions shall (subject to the other provisions of this Warrant) apply; that is to say:—
- (1.) The Parcel shall, as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct, be retained at or forthwith forwarded to such place as the Postmaster-General may appoint, and may, if necessary, be there opened and examined.
 - (2.) Where the name and address of the sender can be ascertained from the Parcel or any form accompanying the same, notice shall be given to the sender through the Post Office of the country in which the Parcel was posted that the Parcel will, at his request, in default of any claim on the part of the addressee, be forwarded to a corrected address or returned to him by post, in either case upon the conditions hereinafter mentioned.
 - (3.) Where the name and address of the sender cannot be ascertained as hereinbefore-mentioned, notice of the non-delivery of the Parcel shall be given to the Post Office of the country in which the Parcel was posted.
 - (4.) In either case the notice shall state that in default of the receipt by the Postmaster-General of instructions as to the disposal of the Parcel, during a period to be specified in such notice from some person who, in the Postmaster-General's judgment, is entitled to give such instructions, the Parcel will be returned to the country in which it was posted.
 - (5.) The Postmaster-General may require proof to his satisfaction that an applicant for a Parcel is entitled to receive the same.
 - (6.) The Postmaster-General may, in his discretion, specify in any such notice, or otherwise, the periods during which Parcels may be returned to the senders thereof, and in so doing may have regard to the nature and contents of Parcels.

(7.) Where in the case of a Parcel which cannot be delivered for want of a true direction, the sender corrects the address of the Parcel, the Parcel shall be forwarded to the corrected address, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a.) Where the corrected address of the Parcel is served from the same Post Office as the original address, no new charge shall be made with respect to the delivery of the Parcel.
 - (b.) In any other case there shall be paid a new and distinct rate of postage equal in amount to the rate of postage which would have been chargeable on such Parcel as an Inland Parcel.
- (8.) Where the sender requests a Parcel to be returned to him by post, there shall be charged upon such Parcel a new and distinct rate of postage, according to the rate fixed by this Warrant.
- (9.) A Parcel shall not be given up or returned by post to the sender except upon payment by him of all charges for re-direction or otherwise to which the Parcel has become liable under the provisions of this Warrant, or otherwise by the law of this country, or of any foreign country or British possession.
- (10.) Where no application is made for a Parcel within the period specified in any such notice as aforesaid, or an applicant fails to prove to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General that he is entitled to receive the Parcel, or refuses or fails to pay the charges to which the Parcel has become liable under this Warrant, the Parcel may be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may in his discretion direct or authorize.

Re-direction.

- 10.—(1.) Any Parcel may be re-directed from its original address, or any substituted address, within the United Kingdom, to any country or place with which a Parcel Post from the United Kingdom is established, and in every case of such re-direction there shall be charged on such Parcel in respect of such re-direction a new and distinct rate of postage according to the rates for the time being payable in respect of the transmission of a like Parcel from the United Kingdom to the country or place to which it may be re-directed.
- (2.) Any Parcel may be re-directed from the original address or any substituted address, within the United Kingdom to any other address within the United Kingdom, and in every case of such re-direction there shall be charged on such Parcel in respect of such re-direction, and (if not previously paid) paid by the addressee thereof in money upon the delivery of such Parcel such rate of postage as would in like case be charged upon the Parcel were it an Inland Parcel.
- (3.) No Parcel re-directed to the United Kingdom from a place out of the United Kingdom shall be delivered to the addressee except upon payment of all charges for re-direction or otherwise to which the Parcel has become liable by the law of this country or of any foreign country or British Possession.

Prohibitions.

11. There shall not be posted or conveyed or delivered by post any Parcel—
- (1.) Consisting of or containing any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book or card, or any indecent or obscene article whether similar to the above or not; or
 - (2.) Having thereon or on the cover thereof

any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, or grossly offensive character.

- (3.) Containing or bearing any letter or communication in the nature of a letter except an invoice of the goods contained in the Parcel.
- (4.) Containing any article or thing not authorized by the customs or other laws or regulations of the United Kingdom or Germany or of the country to which the Parcel is addressed.
- (5.) Consisting of or containing—
 - (a.) Any explosive substance.
 - (b.) Any dangerous substance.
 - (c.) Any filth.
 - (d.) Any noxious or deleterious substance.
 - (e.) Any sharp instrument not properly protected.
 - (f.) Except with the special permission of the Postmaster-General, any living creature.
 - (g.) Any article or thing whatsoever which is likely to injure in course of conveyance other Parcels or any receptacle in which the same are conveyed, or an officer of the Post Office or other person who may deal with such Parcel.
- (6.) Consisting of or containing two or more Parcels or other Postal Packets (of the same or of different descriptions) addressed to different persons at different addresses.

Non-compliance with Regulations.

12. In any case not in this Warrant expressly provided for, where any Parcel shall be posted or tendered for conveyance or transmitted by post which in any respect infringes or fails to comply with the Regulations hereinbefore contained, or any of them, such Parcel may be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may in his discretion direct or authorize.

Customs Regulations.

13. Parcels intended to be transmitted by post under the provisions of this Warrant shall not be posted, forwarded, conveyed, or delivered, except subject to such Regulations as are referred to in section 14 of "The Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882."

Application of Inland Parcel Regulations.

14. Except where otherwise provided in this

Warrant the Regulations for the time being applicable to Inland Parcels and the Regulations for the time being relating to the payment of compensation in respect of Foreign and Colonial Parcels and to the treatment of any such Parcels which become offensive or injurious, shall (so far as the same are applicable) apply to Parcels transmissible by post under the provisions of this Warrant.

Remission of Postage.

15. The Postmaster-General may, in any case in which he may consider it just or reasonable so to do, remit any postage or any sum made payable under this Warrant.

Commencement of Warrant.

16. This Warrant shall come into operation on the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area declared by Order of the Board dated the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the petty sessional division of Linton in the county of Cambridge,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall as from the commencement of this Order cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, and shall for the purposes of the first-mentioned Order dated the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four be deemed to be the Area described in the Schedule to that Order, and as from the commencement of this Order the said first-mentioned Order shall be read and have effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

**THE SWINE-FEVER (INFECTED AREAS)
ORDER OF 1894, No. 3.**

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Infected Area.

1. This Order shall apply only to an Area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a

Swine-Fever Infected Area which Area is in this Order referred to as an Infected Area.

Movement of Swine.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any Order of the Board or any Regulation of a Local Authority thereunder swine shall not be moved by land or by water out of an Infected Area otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Movement of Fat Swine out of Infected Area for Slaughter.

3. Fat swine may for the purpose of being slaughtered be moved from a place in an Infected Area but not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place to premises not within that Infected Area with a Movement Licence (in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) of the Local Authority of the District in which the place from which the swine are to be moved is situate in manner and under the conditions following—

- (i.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which and the premises to which the swine are to be moved for slaughter.
- (ii.) The swine, before the movement is commenced, shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (iii.) If the swine are to be moved into or through the District of another Local Authority then (subject to the provisions of this Order as to agreements respecting movement between Local Authorities of Districts within the Infected Area) there must also be a further Movement Licence of that other Local Authority, which further Licence must be obtained before the movement commences.
- (iv.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence or Licences required by this Article.
- (v.) The swine moved under this Article shall be slaughtered within four days after their arrival at the premises specified in the Licence; and the Local Authority of the District in or into which the swine are moved shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the specified premises and are slaughtered there within such four days.
- (vi.) The swine while being moved under this Article and until they are slaughtered shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all swine not marked for slaughter under this Order.

Movement of Swine out of Infected Area for Purposes other than Slaughter.

4.—(1.) Swine may be moved from premises in an Infected Area but not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place to a specified place not within that Infected Area with a Movement Licence (in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the swine are to be moved are situate, which Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and

description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the swine or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect hereinafter provided, as to the correctness of which Declaration the said Local Authority shall satisfy themselves before granting the Licence.

(2.) The Declaration shall be to the effect—

(a.) that the swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other pig has been brought on to those premises within such period; and

(b.) that the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever.

(3.) If the swine are to be moved into or through the District of another Local Authority then (subject to the provisions of this Order as to agreements respecting movement between Local Authorities of Districts within the Infected Area) there must also, be a further Movement Licence of that other Local Authority, which further Licence must be obtained before the movement commences.

(4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence or Licences required by this Article.

(5.) The swine shall be moved to the specified place by a route to be prescribed in the Licence. The swine after they are received at the specified place shall be kept for twenty-eight days under the supervision of the Local Authority and shall not be moved from that place until after the expiration of that period.

(6.) A Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them under this Article.

Movement of Swine within Infected Area.

5. Movement of swine within an Infected Area is subject to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894 for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine into or within their District, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of swine in contravention of this Order.

As to Movement of Swine by Railway through Infected Area or a District of a Local Authority.

6. For the purposes of this Order, swine shall not be deemed to be moved out of an Infected Area or into or through the District of a Local Authority where they are moved through such Area or District by railway from a place outside such Area or District to another place outside such Area or District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such Area or District.

As to Movement of Swine landed from Ireland through an Infected Area.

7. For the purposes of this Order, swine landed from Ireland at a port or place in an Infected Area shall not be deemed to be moved out of that Infected Area where they are moved out of that Infected Area to any place of destination in accordance with the following conditions:

(a.) When landed the swine shall be moved forthwith by the most direct available route to the nearest available railway-station (such station being within the Infected Area in

which the swine are landed) on the line of railway by which the swine are to be moved to their place of destination.

(b.) The swine shall be kept at the said railway-station until trucked, and shall then be moved by railway to the place of destination without untrucking.

Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.

8. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, swine may be moved in any circumstances with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Agreements between Local Authorities of Districts within an Infected Area respecting Movement of Swine.

9.—(1.) With respect to the movement of swine under this Order from a place in the District of one Local Authority (such place being within an Infected Area) into or through the District or part of the District of another Local Authority (such District or part being also within the same Infected Area), those Local Authorities may, if they think fit, notwithstanding anything in this Order, agree that movement to a specified slaughter-house, or movement in any other case specified in the agreement, or movement in all cases under this Order, may be made without a Movement Licence of the secondly-mentioned Local Authority.

(2.) Every agreement under this Article shall be expressed to be, and shall be deemed to constitute, a Licence for movement in each case to which it relates.

(3.) Every such agreement shall provide that a copy of every Licence granted by one Local Authority for movement into or through the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the first-mentioned Local Authority to such other Local Authority.

(4.) Every such agreement shall be in writing signed by the respective clerks of the Local Authorities, by special direction of the respective Local Authorities, and may be at any time revoked by either of the Local Authorities parties thereto, and every such agreement or revocation shall be published in such manner as the respective Local Authorities consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same.

(5.) A copy of every such agreement shall be sent by the Local Authorities agreeing to every railway company having a railway station in the District of either of those Local Authorities, and a copy shall also be sent to the Secretary, Railway Clearing House, 123, Seymour Street, Euston Square, London, N.W., and no railway company shall be bound to have regard to any agreement of which they have not received a copy.

(6.) Notice of the revocation or determination of any such agreement shall be given to every such railway company, and also to the Secretary of the Railway Clearing House; and every agreement of which a copy is so sent shall, as regards each railway company, be treated as in force until notice of the revocation or determination thereof is given to that railway company.

(7.) If at any time the Board are satisfied with respect to any such agreement that the same is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Granting of Movement Licences.

10.—(1.) A Licence shall only be granted for the movement of swine under this Order where in the opinion of the Local Authority or the person granting the Licence, as the case may be, the granting of such Licence is necessary or expedient.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the swine, or exposing the swine for sale, or by the purchaser thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting the sale at which the swine are exposed, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Delivery of Declarations.

11.—(1.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order is not available except when accompanied by the Declaration, if any, on which it is granted.

(2.) The person granting such Movement Licence under this Order shall, for the identification of the Declaration produced to him, mark the same by signing his name thereon, with the date of the production thereof to him.

(3.) The person granting such Movement Licence shall deliver the Declaration produced to him, when so marked, with the Licence, to the person receiving the Licence from him.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

12.—(1.) Every person in charge of a pig or thing being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

13.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and

defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(5.) If a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(6.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

14. In this Order—

The Board means the Board of Agriculture:
Swine-Fever Infected Place means a Place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board:
Fat swine means swine intended for slaughter:
Article means Article of this Order.

Revocation of Order.

15. The Order described in the Second Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Order hereby revoked, or affect any licence, or authority granted, or any agreement made, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Extent.

16. This Order extends to Great Britain.

Commencement.

17. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

Notwithstanding anything in the Norfolk Swine-Fever Order of 1894 dated the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, swine, fat or store, may from and after the commencement of this Order be moved by land or by water into any of the Districts named in the Second Schedule to that Order without a Licence and without being subject to the restrictions contained in Article 3 of that Order; but nothing herein shall authorize movement of swine into any of such Districts in contravention of any Regulation made by the Local

Authority of such District prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine, fat or store, into their District.

2. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to interfere with or affect the operation of the Norfolk Swine-Fever Order of 1894 so far as the same relates to the movement of swine out of any of the Districts named in the Schedule to that Order.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

4. This Order may be cited as THE NORFOLK SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1894, No. 2.

The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, and shall for the purposes of the first-mentioned Order dated the twenty-first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four be deemed to be the Area described in the Schedule to that Order, and as from the commencement of this Order the said first-mentioned Order shall be read and have effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.
