THE following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 :—

STATUTES to alter the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 40" and 41 Victoria Chapter 48" in relation to the University of Cambridge and now submitted for the approval of Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

We the Chancellor Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers given to us by the 53rd section of the said Act, do hereby alter the Statutes framed by the said Commissioners in relation to our said University in manner following :—

By substituting in Statute A Chapter II, "Degrees," for the section intituled "*Bachelors of Arts*" being Section 2 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 2 of the same Chapter :—

SECT. 2. *Bachelors of Arts.*

Bachelors of Arts, who have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted Inceptors in Arts at the end of six years from the end of their first term of residence, provided that not less than two years have elapsed from their inauguration : and after such admission they shall be created Masters of Arts at the time prescribed by the University.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "*Bachelors of Law*" being Section 6 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 6 of the same Chapter :—

SECT. 6. *Bachelors of Law.*

Bachelors of Law, or Bachelors of Arts, who have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances, of the University may be admitted Inceptors in Law at the end of six years from the end of their first term of residence, provided that not less than two years have elapsed since their inauguration.

After such admission they shall have the same rank and privileges as Inceptors in Arts. They shall be created Masters of Law at the time prescribed by the University and shall have then the same rank and privileges as Masters of Arts.

Masters of Arts, also, who have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted Inceptors in Law, and shall afterwards be created Masters of Law, and shall not thereby lose their rank and privileges.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "*Students in Science*" being Section 12 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 12 of the same Chapter :—

SECT. 12. *Students in Science.*

Students in Science, who, having already taken a degree in Arts, Law, Medicine, Surgery or Music, have given proof of distinction in Science by some original contribution to the advancement

of science, and have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted to the title of Doctor Designate in Science, and shall afterwards be created Doctors at the time prescribed by the University. Provided that only those graduates in Music shall be qualified for such admission and creation who had before graduation kept at least nine terms by residence.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "*Students in Letters*" being Section 13 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 13 of the same Chapter :—

SECT. 13. *Students in Letters.*

Students in Letters, who, having already taken a Degree in Arts, Law, Medicine, Surgery or Music, have given proofs of distinction by some original contribution to the advancement of Learning, and have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted to the title of Doctor Designate in Letters, and shall afterwards be created Doctors at the time prescribed by the University. Provided that only those graduates in Music shall be qualified for such admission and creation who had before graduation kept at least nine terms by residence.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "*Students in Music*" being Section 14 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 14 of the same Chapter :—

SECT. 14. *Students in Music.*

Students in Music shall keep by residence at least nine terms. They shall pursue such studies and pass such examinations as the University may from time to time prescribe by Grace. Having done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University they may be admitted to the title of Bachelor Designate in Music and shall afterwards be inaugurated Bachelors of Music at the time prescribed by the University.

For seven years from and after the beginning of the academical year next following the day on which the assent of the Queen in Council is given to these Statutes, Students in Music may be admitted to the Degree of Bachelor of Music although they have not kept terms by residence, provided that in other respects they have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University.

Bachelors of Music who have, previously to graduation, kept by residence at least nine terms, and who have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted Inceptors in Music at the end of three years from their inauguration ; and after such admission they shall be created Masters of Music at the time prescribed by the University.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "*Bachelors in Music*" being Section 15 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 15 of the same Chapter :—

SECT. 15. *Bachelors of Music.*

Persons not being less than thirty years of age who have already graduated in some Faculty of the University, have given proofs of distinction in musical composition, and have done all that is required by the Ordinances of the University, may be admitted to the title of Doctor Designate in Music, and shall afterwards be created Doctors at the time prescribed by the University.

For five years from and after the beginning of the academical year next following the day on
