(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.) By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area declared by Order of the Board dated the seventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),-in the county of Cambridge included within a boundary line commencing at Pampisford Railway Station, and thence proceeding along the side of the railway in an easterly direction to Bartlow Railway Station, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road leading from Bartlow to West Wratting to a point where the road from West Wickham to Balsham crosses the road from Bartlow to West Wratting, thence in a north-westerly direction along the road leading from West Wickham to Fulbourn to a point where the road from Newmarket to Pampisford Railway Station crosses the road from Balsham to Fulbourn, thence in a south-westerly direction along the said Newmarket-road until it reaches

Pampisford Railway Station aforesaid; the said roads, railway, and railway stations and premises described as the boundary line not being included in the Area,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, hereby declared to be free from footand-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid; shall as from the commencement of this Order cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-aud-mouth disease, and shall for the purposes of the Order of the Board dated the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four be deemed to be the Area described in the Schedule to that Order, and as from the commencement of this Order the said Order of the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four shall be read and have effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.
