

the relief of the poor in each ward of the said parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the wards of the said parish of St. James, Westminster, be re-arranged in manner following, that is to say, that the said parish be divided into four wards, and that the wards be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the undermentioned Schedule, that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such

wards shall be those described in the second column of the said Schedule, and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule.

And the London County Council doth further order that this Order shall come into force for the purpose of the first election of vestrymen under the Local Government Act, 1894, and such election shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act.

Golden-square	Comprising all that part of the parish of St. James, Westminster, bounded on the west by a line drawn along the centre of Regent-street from Glasshouse-street to Beak-street; on the north by a line drawn along the centre of Beak-street to Lexington-street, along the centre of Lexington-street from Beak-street to Broad-street, and along the centre of Broad-street and Edward-street, from Lexington-street to the parish boundary in Wardour-street; on the east by the parish boundary from Edward-street to Coventry-street; on the south by the parish boundary from Wardour-street to Haymarket, thence by a line drawn along the centre of the road on the north side of Piccadilly-circus to the Quadrant, and along the centre of the Quadrant to Glasshouse-street	12
Church ...	Comprising all that part of the parish of St. James, Westminster, bounded on the west by the parish boundary from Jermyn-street to Conduit-street; on the north by the parish boundary in Conduit-street to Regent-street; on the east by a line drawn along the centre of Regent-street, the Quadrant, and the road on the north side of Piccadilly-circus to Haymarket, and thence by the parish boundary in Haymarket to Jermyn-street; on the south by a line drawn along the centre of Jermyn-street from the parish boundary on the east to the parish boundary on the west	12
Pall Mall ...	Comprising all that part of the parish of St. James, Westminster, bounded on the west by the parish boundary from the south-western corner of the parish to Jermyn-street; on the north by a line drawn along the centre of Jermyn-street from the parish boundary on the west to the parish boundary on the east; on the east by the parish boundary from Jermyn-street to the south-eastern corner of the parish; on the south by the parish boundary	12
