ARTICLE IV.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the duties and powers of the said George Henry Brett as regards any proceedings in relation to any Audit which may have been held by him as District Auditor for the said Audit District; or with the duties and powers of the said Alfred Walker Dolby as Assistant Auditor in the said North Western Counties Audit District until the Seventeenth day of January instant, or as regards any proceedings in relation to any Audit held by him as such Assistant Auditor prior to that date.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order—
The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

By the Board of Agriculture:

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every

other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area declared by Order of the Board dated the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—in the county of Cambridge included within a boundary line commencing at a point where the Roman road crosses the road from Balsham to Hildersham, thence along the latter road in a southerly direction to its junction with the back road from Bartlow to Little Abington, thence along the latter road in a south-easterly direction to its junction with the main road leading from Linton to Balsham, thence in a northerly direction along the latter road to its junction with the Roman road aforesaid, and thence along the latter road in a westerly direction to its junction with the road from Balsham to Hildersham aforesaid; the said roads described as the boundary line not being included in the Area,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall as from the commencement of this Order cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, and shall for the purposes of the Order of the Board dated the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four be deemed to be the Area described in the Schedule to that Order, and as from the commencement of this Order the said Order of the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four shall be read and have effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

Prohibition of Conveyance of Animals by Steamship Skerryvore.

1. It shall not be lawful during the continuance of this Order for any person to convey or cause to be conveyed any animals to or from any port in Great Britain by the steamship Skerryvore registered at the port of Glasgow, official number 86730, and now owned by the Clyde Shipping
